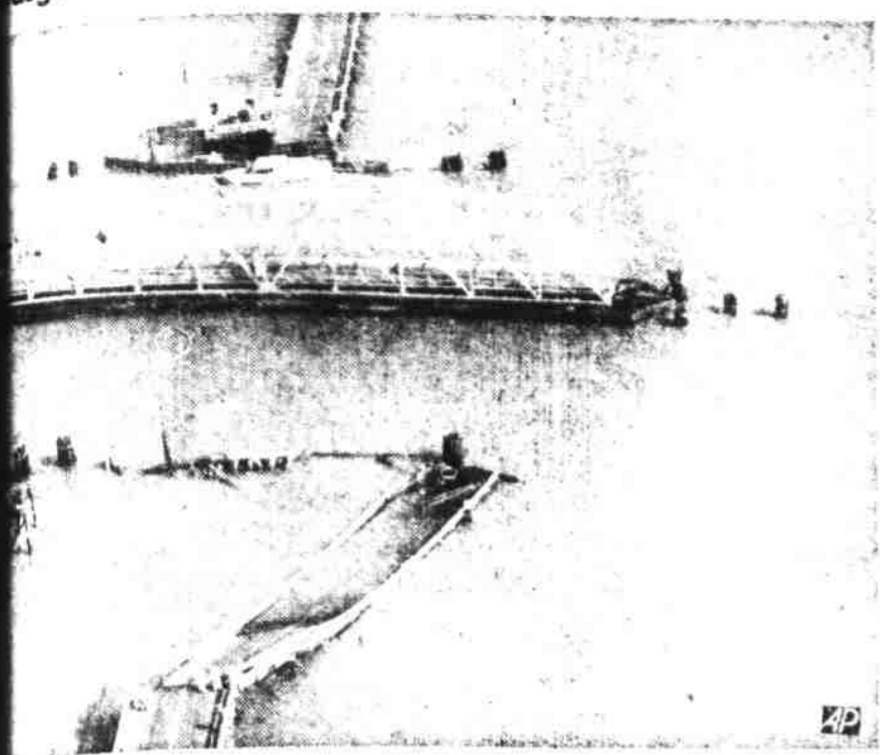


### Large Wrecks Bridge Across Bogue Sound



The Morehead City-Atlantic Beach bridge across Bogue Sound lies in ruins after a huge gust of wind and tide and crashed into the span, State Highway Department says.
