USE MOUNTAINEER WANT ADS. NOTICE OF PROPOSED ORDINANCE FOR THE EXTENSION OF THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE TOWN OF WAYNESVILLE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF WAYNESVILLE AS FOLLOWS: Section 1. That pursuant to Chapter 725 of the General Session Laws of 1947 of North Carolina, that the corporate limits of the Town of Waynesville shall be extended to include, to be annexed, a portion of what is known as East Waynesville, described and bounded as follows:

BEGINNING at a stake in the center of East Street in Waynesville city limit line, and runs with the center of East Street the following calls: N. 39° 30' E. 272 feet; N. 37° 30' E. 200 feet; N. 24° E. 157 feet; N. 44° 45' E. 100 feet; N. 72° E. 25.8 feet to the forks of a street, thence continuing with the center of East Street N. 24° 15' E. 200 feet; N. 16° 45' E. 352 feet; N. 20° 0' E. 266 feet; thence N. 1° 30' E. 200 feet; thence N. 0° 40' E. 182 feet to the edge of the pavement of State Highway No. 19-23, thence east on highway N. 14° 35' E. 1271 feet to a spanish oak on top of a ridge, thence S. 72° 10' W. 600 feet to a fence stake on the North bank of the road, thence S. 81° W. 660 feet to a large chestnut West of the top of the ridge West of Bob Leatherwood's dwelling; thence N. 85° 30' W. 498 feet to a small black oak on ridge; thence N. 29° 10' W. 125 feet to a stake; thence N. 41° W. 125 feet to a white oak thence S. 75° 35' W. 118 feet to a spanish oak near R. H. Gibson's dwelling; thence N. 70° 15' W. 62 feet to a stake at or near M. O. Galloway farm corner; thence N. 83° 40' W. 624 feet to a sycamore; thence N. 75° 30' W. 132 feet to a stake in the center of Richland Creek; thence up the center of said creek two calls as follows: S. 30° 05' W. 143 feet; S. 55° W. 625 feet; S. 10° 30' W. 60 feet to a stake in the present corporate line, thence running with the present corporation line to the BEGINNING stake in the center of East Street.

Section 2. That this notice shall be published in The Waynesville Mountaineer a newspaper published in Waynesville, Haywood County, N. C. for four successive weeks, and the property owners and the qualified voters in the territory hereinabove described, and the qualified voters within the Town of Waynesville will take notice that a meeting will be held by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Waynesville at the usual meeting place of the Board at the Mayor's office in the town hall on the 28th day of October, 1948 at 3:00 o'clock P. M. for the purpose of hearing objections to the final passing of the ordinance extending the corporate limits to include the territory herein described.

And the property owners and qualified voters residing within the said area proposed to be annexed will take notice that if they desire a referendum on the question of said annexation that if a petition shall be filed signed by at least fifteen per cent of the qualified voters residing in the area proposed to be annexed, requesting a referendum on the question of annexation the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Waynesville will submit the question as to whether said territory shall be annexed in the manner provided by

law, to the vote of the qualified voters of the area hereinbefore described proposed to be annexed. The qualified voters residing within the corporate limits of the Town of Waynesville will take notice that if they desire a referendum on the question of annexation, if a petition shall be filed at the said meeting signed by fifteen per cent of the qualified voters residing within the present corporate limits of the Town of Waynesville requesting a referendum on the question of annexation of the territory hereinbefore described, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Waynesville will submit the question as to whether the said territory shall be annexed as provided by law, to a vote of the qualified voters within the present corporate limits of the Town of Waynesville.

Notice is further given that if a petition is not filed by fifteen per cent of the qualified voters residing within the territory proposed to be annexed, nor a petition filed by fifteen per cent of the qualified voters residing within the present corporate limits of the Town of Waynesville, within the Mayor and Board of Aldermen on or before 3:00 o'clock P. M. October 28, 1948 requesting a referendum on the question of annexation of the territory hereinbefore described, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Waynesville, including the additional territory hereinbefore described, which additional territory shall be subject to all the laws, ordinances, and regulations in force in said Town of Waynesville and which may hereafter be enacted, and shall be entitled to the same privileges and benefits as the other parts of said Town of Waynesville, and the new territory shall be subject to municipal taxes levied for the fiscal year following the date of annexation.

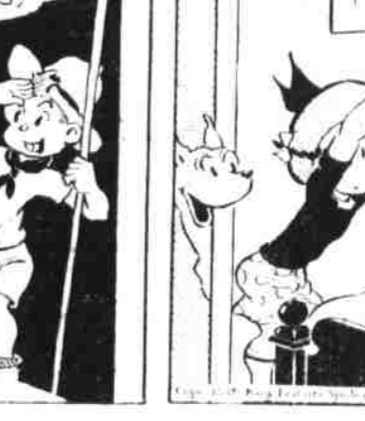

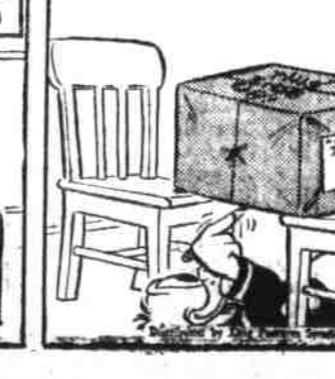
