Womack, Ensley, Pate Lead Locals To Victory

The Waynesville Mountaineers defeated a fighting but outclassed Black Bear eleven from Canton here Friday night before an estimated crowd of 5,000 sport fans. The Black Bears were held at bay except for one scoring threat late in the third quarter which ended when the Mountaineers threw up a stiff defense and held on their own 17 yard line.

The Mountaineers lost little time in getting started. Waynesville kicked off to the Bears and after three downs the Canton team pointed to the Waynesville 37. The Mountaineers could not gain and after another exchange of kicks they were in possession of the ball on their own 27 yard line. With Ensley, Davis and Limer carrying the mail, the Mountaineers moved all the way to the Canton 24 but a clipping penalty set them back to their 39.

Canton held for downs on the Waynesville 33 and the first scoring threat of the evening was stopped. On the next play, Allen faded and shot a pass to left end Frank Pate for 18 yards and Canton's first down of the game. The Waynesville line was tackling hard and Canton fumbled, with Ensley, Waynesville's husky fullback, viciously tackling it, takes well conditioned men to play the game when Waynesville and Canton meet.

During half-time the band formed what appeared to be a circle but when the field lights were turned out, the members turned on small lights and a full moon came out with the song "Carolina Moon".
