Killing Wife Was Not A Mistake, Man Says

"Killing my wife wasn't a mistake, but shooting myself in the arm was an accident," Roy Cockrell, 42, tenant farmer in Spring Hope, told Sheriff Faulkner at Rocky Mount Sanitarium today. Cockrell related that after he killed his wife, Eva Batts, 40, in a field near their home yesterday afternoon, he loaded the single-barreled gun again and when he propped it against a truck, it discharged.

Senator Hoey Advocates Warlick's Nomination

U. S. Senator Clyde Hoey said in Shelby today that he would ask President Truman to place the nomination of Judge Wilson Warlick for federal judge of the western state district before leaving the senate early after the 81st congress convenes.

Stating that the Democratic victory "means that the average man has won", Hoey said the victory assures senate confirmation of about 700 postmasters, U. S. marshals, district attorneys and federal judges whose nominations the last Republican senate declined to confirm.

Jack Edwards Is Stationed At Nanking

Commander Jack E. Edwards of Waynesville will be stationed permanently at Nanking, China in an advisory committee, it was learned from local relatives yesterday.

Commander Edwards has been touring the Far East since he commanded a destroyer division there last time on a tour of duty. During travels through Asia, the Naval officer has made a collection of newspapers which he recently sent to The Mountaineer.

With 18 years of service with the National Service, Commander Edwards is expected to be stationed at Nanking for the next two or three years. His wife, the former Millie Schriber, and son, Jack, Jr., will join the commander in Nanking within the next few weeks.

The collection of newspapers were made during the months of July, August and September of this year and ranging from Singapore to Bombay, India. The city of Bombay has 12 different newspapers including March of the Times, India, Blitz, The Bharat Jyoti, The National Standard, The Bombay Chronicle, The Free Press Journal, The Times of India, and the Straits Times.

Most of the Asia newspapers are similar to the ones in the United States, with the exception that advertisements appear on the front page, which is something different from American papers. The majority have flashy headlines and plenty of pictures on the first page.
