Farm Questions and Answers (Compiled by Extension Service at State College)

Question: What is the recommended treatment for ringworm on cattle?

Answer: The usual herdman's method is to apply tincture of iodine to the affected parts. It should be used each day for several days in a row, but care should be taken not to get the iodine into the eyes of the animal. The herdman, too, needs to be on guard against infection. The best way to do this is to wear gloves during the treatment.

Question: I do not have any silage for this winter but I have plenty of grain and good alfalfa hay. What would be a proper feeding program for a dairy herd?

Answer: If you have plenty of alfalfa hay your dairy herd feeding problem is an easy one to solve. Almost any grain or grain mixture such as corn or oats will balance the rations for both milking cows and growing heifers. Just to make sure that your herd is getting enough phosphorus, it might be a good idea to add 100 to 150 pounds of wheat bran to a 1,000-pound mixture of corn and oats.

Question: What will happen if I plant some second generation hybrid corn seed?

Answer: You'll be cheating yourself. It is the nature of hybrids to break up in the second generation, and a big drop in yield always results. The decline in yield of both ears and fodder may run from 15 to 30 per cent. The only safe and sensible thing to do is to use only first generation seed.
