Symphony No. 4 in A Minor by Sibelius; Tchaikovsky's Nutcracker Suite and Symphony No. 5 in E Minor; Siegfried Idyll by Wagner;

Rhapsody in Blue by Gershwin; and a group of Strauss Waltzes.

Rules governing the circulation of records have been given by Miss Johnston as follows:

1. A record borrower must be a registered borrower of the Haywood County Public Library in good standing.
2. The applicant must be at least fourteen years of age.
3. Borrower may take one album for a week and others may be reserved. A fine of five cents a day will be charged for overdue records.
4. All records will be examined in the presence of the borrower when returned. Borrowers may also request inspection of the records when receiving them. Half the cost of a record will be charged for scratches that mar the recording. All broken records must be returned to the Library.
5. If a record which belongs to an album is broken, the borrower will be charged for the album and the remaining records will become the property of the borrower.
6. Borrowers will not be allowed to browse through the collection. All selections must be made from the card catalog at the desk.
7. Albums will not be split for circulation.

During the social hour following the meeting the members exchanged Christmas gifts.

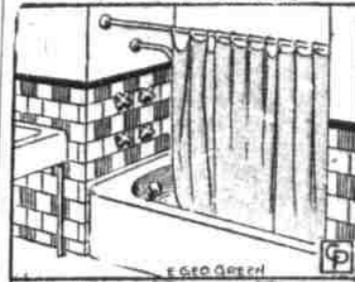
## Bethel Home Club Has Dinner Meeting
