Those composing the board which drafted the letter, include: Col. J. H. Howell, chairman; Mrs. Troy Leatherwood, George A. Brown, Jr., Fred Doult, Mrs. T. Lenoir Gwyn and Glenn C. Palmer. The letter said in part: "The purpose of the fund was to stimulate an interest in county-wide library service and to assist counties in starting such a program. This is just what it did in Haywood county. With the aid from the State, the county and town of Waynesville were able to start county-wide service. The State Aid Fund has been used to help buy books and to pay the salary of a trained librarian."

"Our service was started on a shoestring, but its progress has been unbelievable. To our meager beginnings people have responded with their interest and use of the library facilities. It has grown in its service and is now open all day. It has county hospital service, a Negro branch, and a new bookmobile, which has been serving rural sections since October. This bookmobile was bought from funds raised by the people from all over the county. The circulation of 45,036 for 1947-48 was more than four times that of 1944, before we had State aid."
