

Dorcas Bell Love Chapter, D. A. R. 50th Anniversary Held At Towne House

Highlighting the celebration of the 50th anniversary of the organization of the Dorcas Bell Love Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution, which was held at the Towne House on Thursday, were the address of Miss Gertrude Carraway, state regent, the tribute to the organizing regent by Mrs. S. H. Bushnell, and the history of the chapter by Mrs. Charles E. Quinlan.

Mrs. James W. Killian, regent, opened the meeting and Mrs. T. Lenoir Gwyn, chairman of the event, presided. Around 60 were present including several regents from chapters in the district and other guests.

Miss Carraway, who was introduced by Mrs. W. F. Swift, paid tribute to the record of the chapter, and pointed out that the past should serve as a challenge to greater activity in the future. She spoke of the work done by Mrs. Mary Love Stringfield Wulbern, organizing regent of the chapter, and first elected state regent. She read excerpts from the addresses made by Mrs. Wulbern when she was state regent, 50 years ago. At the close of her talk Miss Carraway was presented an Indian basket of white and yellow filled with apples.

Mrs. S. H. Bushnell gave a sketch of the life of Mrs. Wulbern, telling of her various activities and her work in the local chapter and the state society.

Mrs. Charles E. Quinlan, who was the first secretary of the chapter, read the minutes she wrote of

the first meeting 50 years ago.

Mrs. J. Harden Howell, state chairman of Indian Work, introduced Mrs. Charles Whitaker, past state regent, and Mrs. Edward Bower, state chairman of approved schools. Mrs. R. N. Barber introduced the regents in the district. A response was given by Mrs. Victor McQuire of Asheville.
