prisonment in the discretion of the Court, or both.
Sec. 2. It shall be unlawful for any person, association, firm or corporation to stage or exhibit or put on display any circus, carnival, vaudeville show or any other kind of variety of exhibition whether in a booth, tent, room or other building, indoors or outdoors, in public or in private, in which any one or more of the acts made unlawful pursuant to Section 1 are done or permitted to be done.

"This is a bad case, and I do not have much mercy for a man who steals. I would pass a severe sentence on this young man, but his neighbors testify he has lived a model life; his parents have lived a model life, and he has a fine wife. I don't want to break up a family, therefore I am putting him on probation for 5 years in order to give him a chance. If he fails to abide by the law, then he will get to serve the 3 to 5 year sentence."
Smith's young wife and parents were in court with him all during the two-day trial. Only his parents were here Monday morning.

Sec. 3. That the said burial plot shall continue under the management and supervision of the governing body of the Town of Waynesville, with the advice and approval of the governing body of the County of Haywood, and of said memorial association.
Sec. 4. That the Board of Commissioners of the County of Haywood are hereby authorized and empowered to appropriate out of any funds which may be used lawfully for said purpose an amount not exceeding three thousand two hundred dollars (\$3,200.00) to be used by said memorial association for expenditures in maintaining, improving and beautifying said memorial plot in Greenhill Cemetery.

Tree Seedlings Now Available

Forest tree seedlings are now available to Haywood county farmers, it was announced this week by County Agent Wayne Corpening.

There are many places, in the county, he pointed out that should be put back to trees, and added that seedlings, such as white pine, loblolly, shortleaf pine and poplar seedlings would be furnished free of charge through an arrangement with the North Carolina Forest Service and the TVA authority.

Applications should be made through the county agent's office, and if farmers need other information the county agent will be glad to discuss the proposition with them. He recommends planting about one thousand trees to the acre.

Examinations To Be Held For Clyde Rural Carrier

Civil service examinations will be held here to fill the position of rural carrier at Clyde, it was announced yesterday.

Receipt of the applications will close March 3, it was said. Details can be had at the Waynesville post office.

A standard daily route of 30 miles, has a salary of \$2,470, with \$20 per year for each additional mile. Allowance of 7 cents per mile is allowed for operation and maintenance of vehicle. For a 30-mile route this is \$610.50 per year.
