

### Little Symphony Pleases Two Large Audiences

The North Carolina Little Symphony Orchestra, directed by Dr. Benjamin Swalin played two concerts at the Waynesville High School Auditorium Thursday and Friday night.

The auditorium was filled to capacity at the children's concert given in the afternoon and the program was received with great enthusiasm.

Dr. Swalin was assisted by Mrs. Swalin in giving an introductory description before each number.

The program opened with excerpts from Mozart's Symphony No. 40 in G Minor and included an original composition by Julia DeWkins, a high school junior of Greensboro. The lighter numbers included "On the Trail" from the Grand Canyon Suite and "The Elephant and the Bee."

Adding interest to the program was a musical quiz conducted by Mrs. Swalin in which a group of school students were asked to identify the individual instrument by sound. The group achieved a perfect score and high praise from Mrs. Swalin.

John Calhoun of the Waynesville Junior 4-H club, was judged the best in a field of talent from 21 schools in the contest at the Armory Friday night.

The contest was a feature of the opening program of the third annual Home Appliance Show.

But John just shaded Miss Sammy Haynes of Clyde for top honors, and Billy Bishop of East Waynesville was a close third.

The judges, Hub Caldwell of Waynesville route 2, Mrs. C. C. Francis, Waynesville route 1, and Bob Boone, Waynesville route 1, based their decisions on the applause each contestant or group of contestants drew from the 500 spectators.

The Waynesville boy's vocal talent—his singing and his ability to duplicate the voices of the familiar farm animals and birds—gave him the edge over the field and the \$15 first prize.

To select the three finalists, the judges narrowed the field to representatives from six clubs. The others represented in the final judging were Lake Junaluska, Bethel and Fines Creek.

### All Dogs Must Be Inoculated For Rabies, Says Law

The district health department announced last week the appointment of Dr. A. R. Riegg, Hazelwood veterinarian, as county rabies inspector.

Dr. Riegg plans to launch the 1949 rabies inoculation program for all dogs April 1 in clinics that will be set up throughout the county.

The Department said dog owners must have their pets inoculated against the disease within 90 days after the program starts.

The last two years, the department reported, the response was good. But dog owners were warned that they could be signing their pets' death warrants if they failed to comply with the inoculation law. Dogs found without inoculation tags after the deadline are liable to be put to death.

Such failure also subjects the dog owner to a fine of \$10 to \$50 or a 10-to-30-day sentence.
