Farmer Problems Answered By Authorities On The Subjects

Question: What material should I use to control lime mold?

Answer: For blue mold control the State College Extension Service recommends three trade name materials. They are Dithane Z-78, Karban (Black) and Feroxite. In some localities there are other materials on the market but they have not been officially tested and farmers are advised not to use them for information on how to apply the recommended materials, see some county agent or write the Agricultural Station at State College.

Question: How does bean manure compare with other manure in crop production value?

Answer: Test by the Pennell and Fernald of Station indicate that bean manure has three times as valuable an amount of available nitrogen as other manures. The conclusion is based on results from 13 crops of corn, oats, wheat, potatoes, and tomatoes. Where the 100 lb. bean manure was applied at the rate of nine to 12 tons per acre the total yield were 20 to 30% higher than other manures on which this treatment of 100 lb. manure were used. The influence of bean manure is related to the fact that it is rich in nitrogen and contains a little of the other elements of manure. In bean manure very little of the available nitrogen is lost from the manure.
