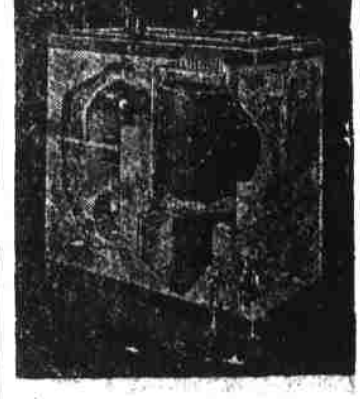

beyond the Call of Duty. I doubt that there is a person living or dead that has given without remuneration more time to the Park and its problems than has Charles Ray. Since the Park was created for the permanent enjoyment of all the people, it is my firm conviction that we in Western North Carolina should in some appropriate way show our appreciation to Charles for his unselfish efforts and devotion to the cause of the Great Smoky Mountains National Park and Parkway. It is thought that it is more fitting to honor our fellow men during their active days than after their barges have sailed beyond seas. It has been said thousands and thousands of times that honor means more to a man when he is alive than when he is dead. But how often do we overlook in these busy and hectic days the single truth of this statement? How often has the world eulogized in death the man it knew slightly and valued less during his lifetime? There is a good moral in our thoughts at this point that we should all take to heart. In all of our relationships and activities with mankind, let's strive to become better acquainted one with another, and when one among us demonstrates qualities of leadership and renders service that is outstanding, let us not permit these virtues to be hidden under a bushel as it were, but render our acclaim and honor forthwith.
Criticism, to which all men are targets, would be easier to withstand if along the highway of life we were more alert and generous to give credit where credit is due. Waterman has expressed this thought so much better than I can that I wish to conclude with a few

lines written by this advocate of the good neighbor policy among men:
If I knew you and you knew me—
If both of us could clearly see,
And with an inner sight divine
The meaning of your heart and mine,
I'm sure that we would differ less
And clasp our hand in friendliness;
Our thoughts would pleasantly agree,

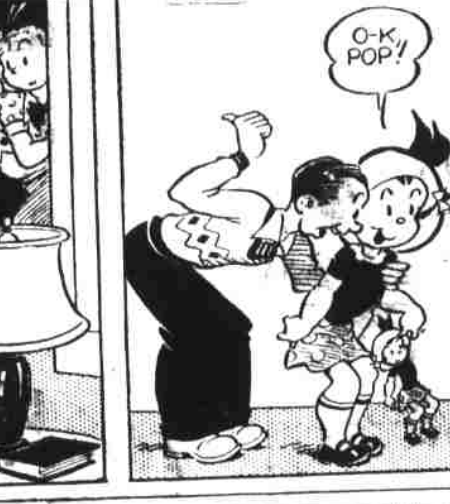
