

**NOTICE OF PROPOSED ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF WAYNESVILLE TO EXTEND ITS CORPORATE LIMITS.**

All persons owning property within the area hereinafter described, and all qualified voters residing within the area hereinafter described, proposed to be annexed by the Town of Waynesville, and all qualified voters residing within the corporate limits of the Town of Waynesville will take notice that the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Waynesville will meet on Thursday, May 26, 1949, at three o'clock P. M. at the Town Hall in the Town of Waynesville for further consideration of adopting ordinances for the extension of the corporate limits of the Town of Waynesville to include within the said corporate limits the following boundary or area, namely:

**BEGINNING** at a stake in the center of the creek, or Browning Branch, at the corner of the recently added corporate limits of the Town of Waynesville, on the Southeast side of U. S. Highway 19A-23 and runs down said creek in a Northerly direction to a stake in the Northerly margin of the road leading to the property known as the J. C. Welch residence near the Tapistry Mill, and runs thence with margin of said road in a Westerly direction to a stake in the center of the street leading in a Northerly direction by the Prison Camp to a point where said line would strike the present Hazelwood corporate limits; thence with the Hazelwood corporate limits in a Westerly direction by the Lee Winchester property to the center of Richland Creek; thence up Richland Creek in a Southerly direction to the mouth of Brendle Creek; thence up Allens Creek in an Easterly direction to the bridge at the road leading to the J. C. Welch residence; thence with said road in a Northerly direc-

M. a petition signed by at least fifteen per cent of the qualified voters residing within the present corporate limits of the town of Waynesville that the question of annexation will also be submitted to the qualified voters of the Town of Waynesville at a special election to be called therefore, as provided by statute.

**Your Housekeeping Shows Condition Of Your Glassware**

Sparkling glassware denotes good housekeeping. But goblets and all glassware will accumulate dust and a cloudy film which dulls the luster.

For pieces that have become clouded, wash in baking soda water. This solution is made by dissolving about three tablespoonfuls of baking soda to each quart of warm water. Baking soda emulsifies the grease film on glassware. Dirt entangled in this deposit will be carried off in the emulsion.

For deep cut or etched glassware, use a baking soda paste. Add just enough water to the baking soda to make a thin paste. Then with a small, soft, clean brush, apply the paste to the crevices. Rinse well and rub dry. Because baking soda is a non-abrasive cleanser, it will never scratch or mar the surfaces of the finest glass.

To remove a ring or deposit from bottles, fill them three-fourths full with baking soda solution. Use the proportion of approximately three tablespoonfuls of baking soda to each quart of water. Dissolve

another room first. The first floor bedroom, equipped with a convenient closet, may also be used as a den or workroom.

The Edwin's second floor bedrooms have large built-in wardrobes. A large storage closet is provided next to the bathroom, with a linen cabinet on one wall.

The exterior walls of The Edwin are frame with stone or brick facing under the second floor projection. The balance of the house is finished with siding. The roof is covered with asphalt shingles.

The dimensions of The Edwin are 28 feet by 24 feet. There is a floor area of 660 square feet and a volume of 17,820 cubic feet, including the full basement.
