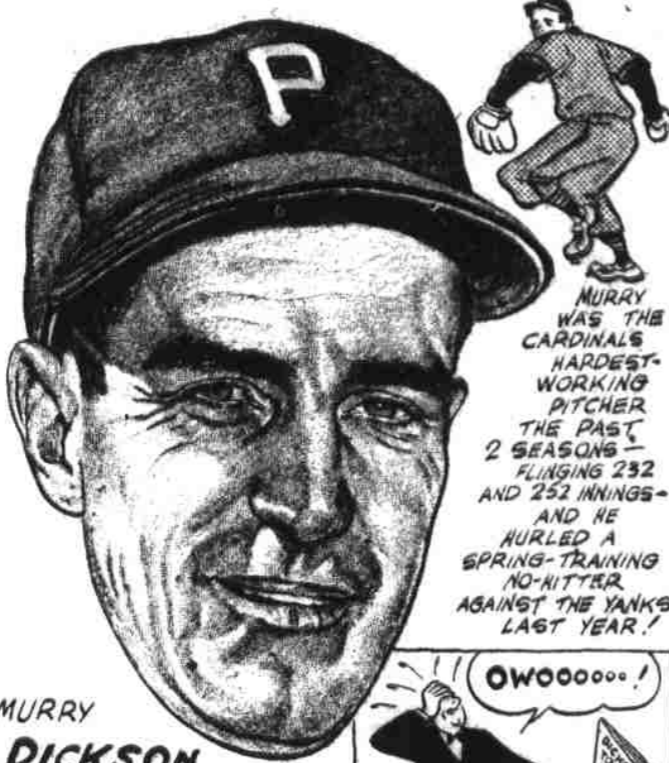

## What's Most Important In Pitching?

# Sain Says: 'Arm.' Neuhouser: 'Legs.'

NEW YORK — Johnny Sain, curve ball artist of the Boston Braves, and Hal Neuhouser, south-paw ace of the Detroit Tigers, have completely different ideas on how to prepare themselves for the opening day of the season.

Sain believes that a pitcher should concentrate on getting his arm in shape, and not worry too much about his legs. Consequently he is not a firm believer in running as a form of exercise.

"The arm is the most important part of the body to a pitcher," he says. "The main thing is to get that in shape. The best way to get the arm in shape is to pitch. If you do enough of that, the legs will take care of themselves."

Neuhouser, a student of the art of conditioning, scoffs at Sain's theory. He goes along with most hurlers who believe that the first duty of a pitcher is get the legs in shape.

"You must get yourself in condition from the ground up," he says. "By that I mean, first get the legs in shape, then the stomach, wind and finally the arm. I don't care how strong your arm is, try and pitch a full nine-inning game and see how rubbery your legs get if they're not in perfect condition."

"Your legs must be strong in any sport. A slight twist or wrench of the leg can cause a sprain in the back or arm. I golf for almost a month just to get my legs in shape. I believe in lots of running. Get your legs in shape and the arm will take care of itself."

So here are two contrasting ideas on how to get in condition and who is there to say which is more correct? Sain won 24 games last year, pitching 28 complete games. It marked the third straight year he gained 20 or more triumphs.

Neuhouser was no slouch either. He captured 21 games, the fourth time in the last five years that he has topped 20.

Neuhouser is 27, Sain 30. Sain broke into organized baseball in 1937, two years before Hal took up the game as a career. Neuhouser, however, reached the big leagues after one season in the minors, while Sain knocked around five years before he got his chance with the Braves.

Three years in the service have kept Sain's victory total down to 69 as compared to 152 for Neuhouser in nine years of pitching.

## WTHS Trackmen Point For Conference Meet

About 65 candidates are running, literally, for the right to represent Waynesville High School in the annual Blue Ridge Conference Track Championships at Asheville School for Boys next Friday.

Coach Carleton Weatherby and his assistants, Carl Ratcliffe and Harry James, have been holding tryouts since last Monday.

Just what kind of a bid Waynesville will make for the crown held by the host Asheville team is unknown right now, Mr. Ratcliffe said.

"We haven't been timing the boys so far," he explained. But indications are that Waynesville will have a larger representation in this year's meet than it had in last year's.

"We're planning to have entries in every event except the discus, javelin, high hurdles, and pole vault," he said. "The greatest competition so far

is for berths in the sprint events. The local boys will have the opportunity of entering the following competitive events in the meet: the 100 and 220-yard dashes, 440, 880 and mile races, 220 low and 120 high hurdles, 880-yard relay and the other events will include, the football throw, baseball throw, football punt, discus throw, 12 pound shot put, high jump and broad jump. At the conclusion of the meet, a handsome trophy will be awarded to the team sending the most points and ribbons will also be awarded to the individual winners of the first three places in each event.
