Pants For Lamb Chops Old Hat Prof Puts Dresses On Fruits And Vegetables

NEW BRUNSWICK, N. J. — Dr. Walter A. MacLinn is putting dresses on fruits and vegetables. The dresses are transparent plastic films.

Dr. MacLinn is professor and chairman of the department of food technology at the Rutgers University College of Agriculture.

Fresh-cut asparagus, he finds, keeps best if it's packaged in cellulose acetate. It doesn't keep as well in other plastics.

But strawberries keep best in another type of bag, and peach-keep best in still another kind. The dress that preserves one food may make another go down hill faster than it would without any protecting garment.

Just why foods show these differences isn't entirely clear. It apparently is due to gases that the foods give off. Some of the gases may help keep it fresh and

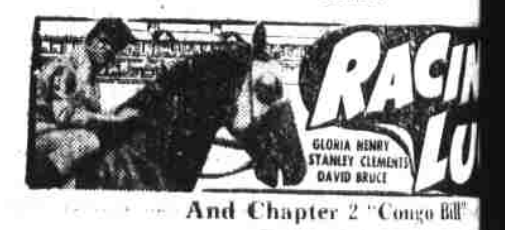

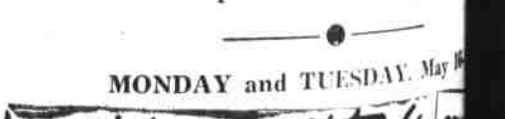
