



1,230 N. C. Drivers Licenses Revoked **During Past April**

A total of 1.230 persons lost their driver's licenses in April as a result of traffic violations, the Department of Motor Vehicles has announced. Of this number 933 were re-

vocations and 237 were suspenvions. The figure represented a drop of 681 from 1,911 who lost their licenses during the same month last year.
