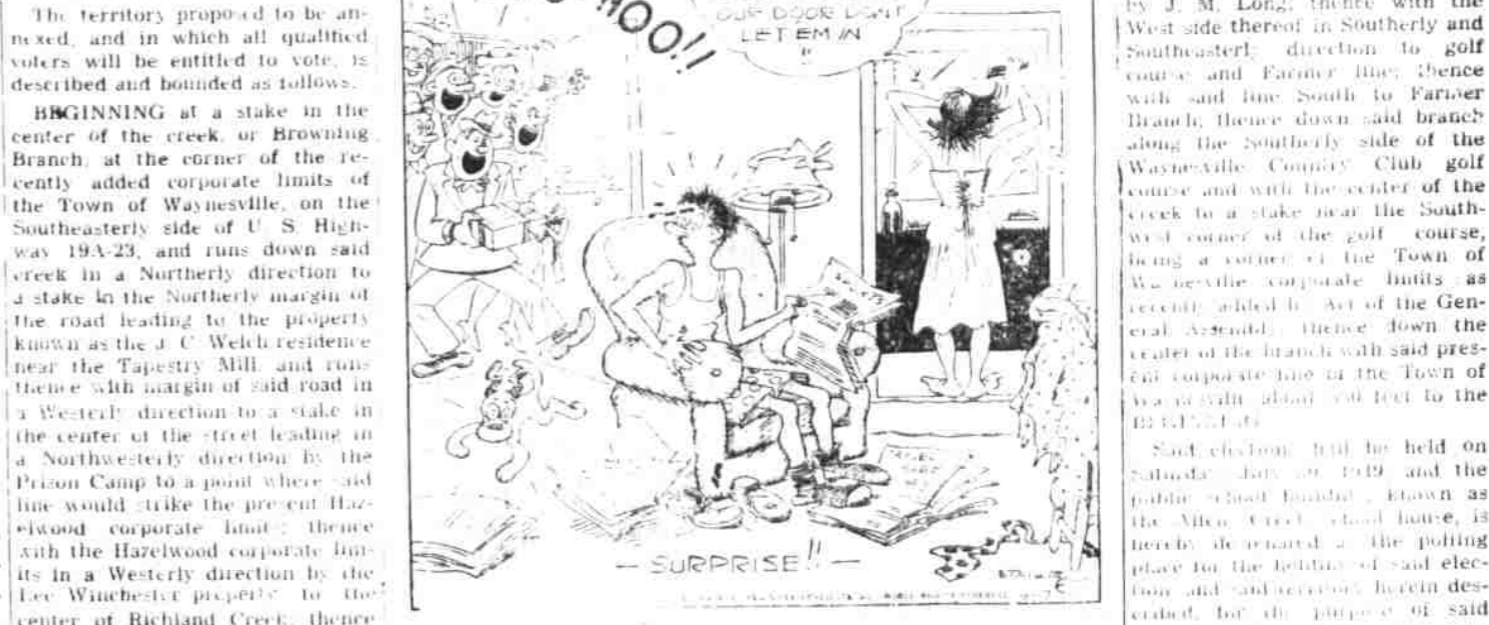

of Waynesville shall be extended to include the area hereinafter described.

The territory proposed to be annexed, and in which all qualified voters will be entitled to vote, is described and bounded as follows:

BEGINNING at a stake in the center of the creek or Browning Branch, at the corner of the recently added corporate limits of the Town of Waynesville, on the Southeastly side of U. S. Highway 19A-23, and runs down said creek in a Northernly direction to a stake in the Northernly margin of the road leading to the property known as the J. C. Welch residence near the Tapestry Mill and runs thence with margin of said road in a Westernly direction to a stake in the center of the street leading to the Prison Camp to a point where said line would strike the present Hazelwood corporate limits; thence with the Hazelwood corporate limits in a Westernly direction by the Lee Winchester property to the center of Richland Creek; thence up Richland Creek in a Southernly direction to the mouth of Brendle Creek; thence up Allens Creek in an Easterly direction to the bridge at the road leading to the J. C. Welch residence; thence with said road in a Northernly direction to a point on the Northernly side of the Southern Railroad tracks; thence along the Westernly side of the railroad to the railroad crossing near the Dayton Rubber Plant at a point on the Southernly side of the highway; thence on the Southernly margin of the highway in a Southernly direction 400 feet to a stake.

Thence S. 75° E. to a stake in the center of the railroad; thence S. 75° E. 250 feet to a stake in the fence line; thence S. 63° 30' E. 297 feet to a stake in the corner of the John Franets land (200 feet South of an 11-inch hemlock); thence S. 71° E. 313 feet to a stake; thence S. 41° E. 293 feet; thence S. 31° 30' E. 365 feet; thence S. 65° E. 333 feet to a P. inch lot in a farm; thence S. 79° 20' E. 105 feet to a point in the East margin of the Alton Creek Road; thence with said margin of said subdivision N. 29° 25' E. to a stake in the turn of a roadway shown on said map at the Southeast corner of said subdivision; thence with the East margin of said road N. 3° 15' E. 179 feet to a point on the Westernly side of Browning Branch.

Thence with Westernly side of said branch (two calls) N. 47° 50' E. 200 feet; N. 11° 1' E. 247 feet; thence S. 69° 10' E. 300 feet to a stake in a fence on a ridge; 20 feet East of an 11-inch pine; thence N. 23° 15' E. 204 feet to a 12-inch forked hemlock; thence N. 49° E. 410 feet to Camp Branch (220 feet to a 12-inch oak on top of a pole marked as a corner; thence N. 23° E. crossing Farmer Branch to a point in the South boundary line of a subdivision; as shown on a map recorded in Map Book 17, Index "F" page 2, and runs thence with the Southernly margin of said subdivision N. 29° 25' E. to a stake in the turn of a roadway shown on said map at the Southeast corner of said subdivision; thence with the East margin of said road N. 3° 15' E. 180 feet to a stake; thence S. 79° 20' E. 105 feet to a point on the Westernly side of Browning Branch.

Thence with Westernly side of said branch (two calls) N. 47° 50' E. 200 feet; N. 11° 1' E. 247 feet; thence S. 69° 10' E. 300 feet to a stake in a fence on a ridge; 20 feet East of an 11-inch pine; thence N. 23° 15' E. 204 feet to a 12-inch forked hemlock; thence N. 49° E. 410 feet to Camp Branch (220 feet to a 12-inch oak on top of a pole marked as a corner; thence N. 23° E. crossing Farmer Branch to a point in the South boundary line of a subdivision; as shown on a map recorded in Map Book 17, Index "F" page 2, and runs thence with the Southernly margin of said subdivision N. 29° 25' E. to a stake in the turn of a roadway shown on said map at the Southeast corner of said subdivision; thence with the East margin of said road N. 3° 15' E. 180 feet to a stake; thence S. 79° 20' E. 105 feet to a point on the Westernly side of Browning Branch.

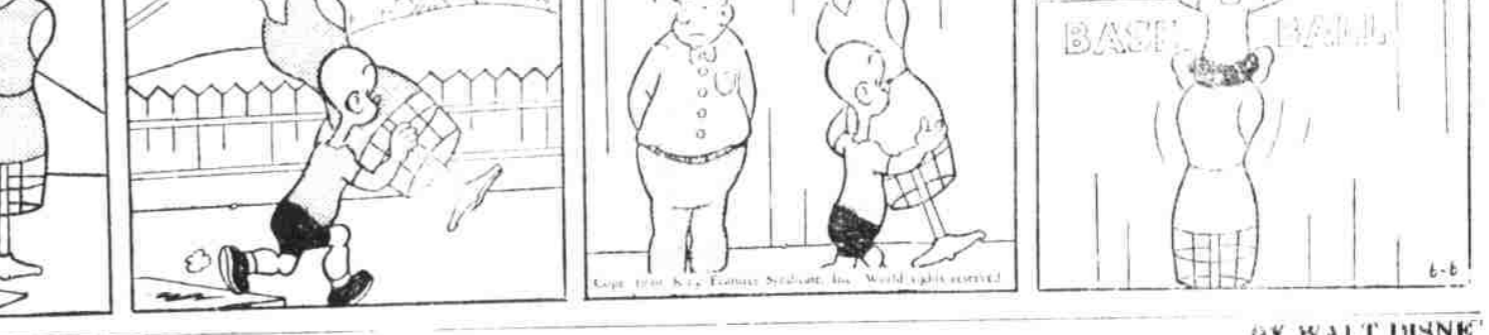
