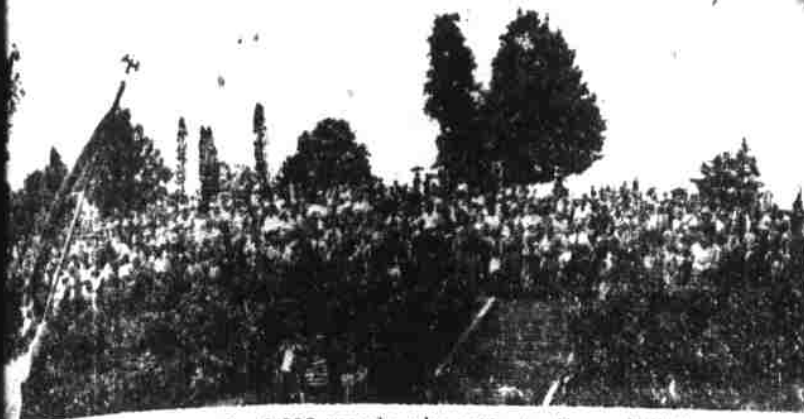

At the May 31 meeting of the West Pigeon Community Development Club at the Bethel School, announcements were made concerning farm problems and committee work for the summer.

After Chairman Jack Sloane called the meeting to order and the Rev. Clyde Collins pronounced the invocation, the audience was told:

1. There is a free test available to determine whether cows have Bangs Disease. If your cow has not been tested, contact your county agent.

2. If you have tobacco plants which you are not going to use, see if your neighbor can use them or turn them in to your county agent. Many tobacco beds were damaged by wildfire. Next year be sure to treat your beds for this disease so that the plants will not be destroyed.

3. On June 29, our club is scheduled for a radio program over Station WHCC. The following committee was appointed to plan the program: M. C. Nix, chairman; Clyde L. Collins, and Mrs. C. S. Terrell.

4. Each committee chairman should call a meeting of his or her respective committee before the next meeting and plan their summer work.

5. Tri-basic copper sulphate is available for use on tomatoes from M. C. Nix.
