space with equipment arranged on two opposite walls. It is located so one end of the living room may be used for dining.

There are 2-story view windows in the living room, one set overlooking the garden, the other the front yard and street. A fireplace can be placed on the end wall of the living room next to the garage.

Closets, with storage space above, are in the bedrooms. There is a coat closet in the vestibule and a linen cabinet and general closet in the bedroom hall.

Exterior walls are frame with siding. The roof, asphalt shingles. There is a wide eave overhang.

The attached garage gives a wide appearance but the area is only 908 square feet and 17,252 cubic feet, including the basement.
