Weekly Music Concerts To Be Given At Library

The first of a series of weekly musical concerts will be held at the Haywood County Library on Thursday, June 30, from 4 to 5 o'clock in the afternoon.

The concerts, sponsored by the Waynesville Music Club under the direction of Mrs. Robert Turner, president, will consist of recordings from the collection at the library.

The program to be given this week is as follows: Beethoven's First Symphony, played by the Vienna Philharmonic Orchestra; Brahms Quintet in B Minor, by the Busch Quartet; Celebrated Operatic Arias with Bulli Savasopiano; and the Metropolitan Opera Orchestra and Debussy's Nocturnes, played by the Orchestra.

Other programs throughout the summer season will include request numbers from the public. They will be held each Thursday at the same hour.

The record collection at the library, which was started only a short time ago, now contains over 100 albums, many of which are classic English recordings. They are circulated from the library in the same manner as books and are becoming increasingly popular.

All music lovers are invited to visit the library for the concerts.

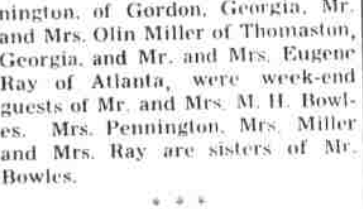
