## Psalms---Songbook of Bible

GOD PRAISED FOR HIS GOODNESS TO MEN

Scriptures—Psalms 1; 33:12-15; 67; 100.

THE WORLD today is in great

need. Food, housing, clothing are

scarce, both mental and physical

suffering are intense, and lack of

liberty in many lands causes trag-

edy to stalk the earth.

It should not be so. The earth

is beautiful and fertile. God made

it so. "There is room for all His

children and food for all, if man

would only obey His laws and His

Son Jesus' command to "love thy

neighbor as thyself."

"Man's inhumanity to man

makes countless thousands

mourn." Indeed, as Robert Burns

tells us.

The word "psalm" comes from

the Greek *psalms*, which means

a poem sung to the accompani-

ment of musical instruments.

There are many hymns of praise

in the psalms, also petitions for

help in times of stress, moral re-

lections on the good life, and

songs of serene trust in the Lord

and His goodness.

King David is thought to have

written 150 psalms. David was

called the "sweet psalmist" (or

singer) of Israel. He loved God

and rejoiced in the prosperity he
