## Panther Creek Farms To Be Studied Saturday

The first of a series of farm tours within Panther Creek community will feature a day-long program Saturday.

Farmers and their families working in the Panther Creek Community Development Program will visit individual farms and homes to see specific types of improvement made since the program started. Current plans are to hold these tours every three months.

These farm visits will be many throughout the morning, starting when the motorcade leaves from Weaver Parker's farm at 8:40 a. m., until after the inspection of Noble Arrington's farm at 12:30 p. m., when the visitors will take time out for lunch.

In the afternoon, starting at 2 o'clock, discussions by community leaders will be made on the various phases of community improvement and development.

First stop on the farm-to-farm tour will be Glen Fincher's farm, where the party is scheduled to arrive at 9 a. m. There, the visitors will inspect equipment, storage space, the barn, and see a demonstration of strip farming behind a team.

Next the party will go to Amos Arrington's, where they will arrive at 10:50 a. m., to examine the corn and tobacco crops and the example of strip cropping.

At 11:15 a. m., they will examine the dairy barn, alfalfa, corn, strip cropping, and dairy and beef cattle at Weaver Parker's farm.

### Hazelwood Soldier Finishes Course

Pvt. Albert E. Nichols, son of Clayton M. Nichols of Hazelwood, graduated recently from the medical technician course at the Army Medical Field Service School, Fort Sam Houston, Texas.

North Carolina Agriculture Commissioner L. Y. Ballentine, recently announced the appointment of the Rev. Herbert W. Baucum, former pastor of the First Baptist church of Waynesville, as state director of the North Carolina Christian Rural Overseas Program. Mr. Baucum, now a resident of Black Mountain, will start work within the next week with 17 district supervisors to set up an organization for collecting farm commodities for overseas relief. He will have charge of the state program. The organization will work through all the state's 100 counties in the campaign.

Mr. Baucum, a graduate of Wake Forest and the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary of Louisville, Ky., has served as pastor in charges at Carthage, Smithfield, Winston-Salem, Wilmington and Morehead City, in addition to Black Mountain and Waynesville.

He also served as chaplain of the Good Samaritan Mission in Asheville for five years and was Wake Forest alumni secretary during the war years.

Last year, CROP collected 2,500 carloads of wheat, corn, milk, peanuts, cotton, and other items that were shipped to approximately 40 European and Asiatic nations.

Seventy of the state's counties took part in gathering 55 carloads of food.

## Wellco Shoe Corp. Head Seeking To Recover Plant Seized In 1935

Heinz W. Rollman, 37-year-old head of the Wellco Shoe Corp. of Hazelwood, is in Germany attempting to recover his \$2,000,000 factory at Gusterath.

An Associated Press dispatch from Frankfurt quotes Mr. Rollman as saying the Nazis confiscated the rubber footwear plant in forced bankruptcy proceedings in 1935, when they drove him from Germany.

Under the restitution provisions covering property the Nazis seized illegally, the Waynesville man has been awarded \$300,000 for other property he had in Germany.

Mr. Rollman took his case to a German state court last Saturday after the present operators of the shoe factory opposed his efforts to recover.

Another hearing was set for Monday. But the verdict of the court will not be known for several weeks.

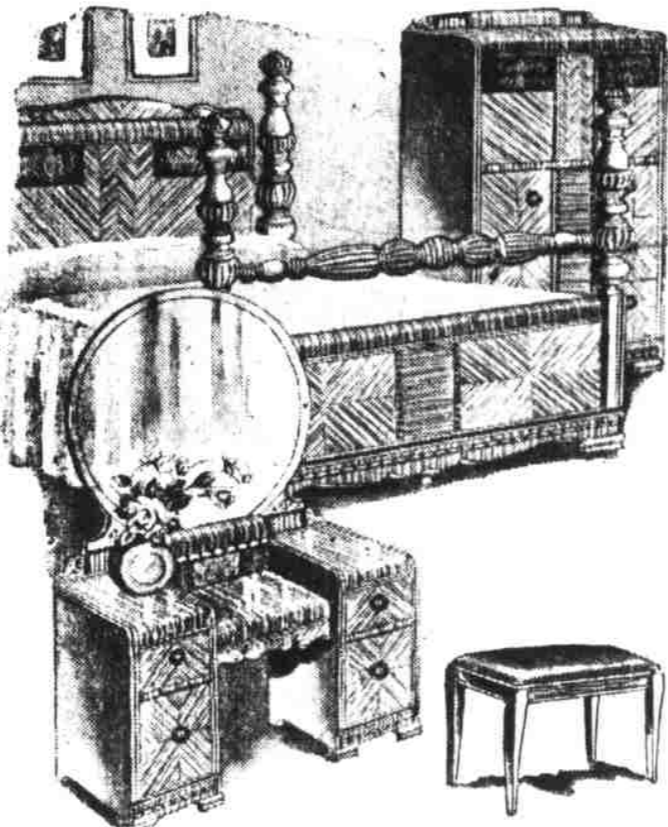
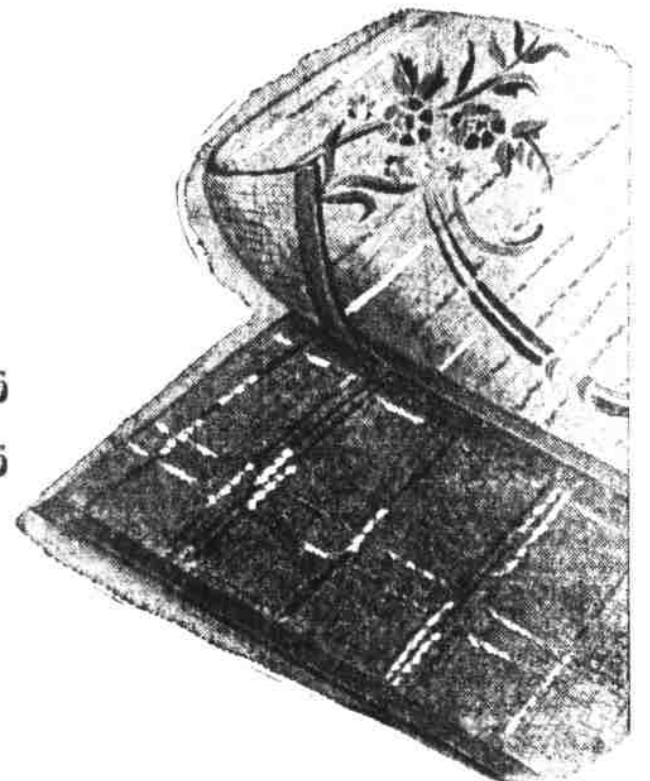
