Hallett Ward Is Member Of Touring Camp

Hallett Ward, Jr., left Asheville last Monday with a group of eleven boys on a motor trek to Alaska by way of the Northwest and Canadian Rockies. The group is part of Camp Vagabond, a touring camp for boys, conducted by Charles H. Pavlek, master at Asheville School. In addition to Mr. Pavlek the camp staff is composed of Mrs. Pavlek, Miss Charlotte Hardin, Asheville School nurse, and Joe Lindner, pre-medical student at Dartmouth College, counselor and driver. The mobile group of two station wagons and two trailers will motor up the Alaska Highway to Fairbanks and return to the States via the SS Aelutian on a six-day cruise along the Inside Passage of the Pacific. On their way north, the group will ride horseback in the Tetons, fish and see the sights in Yellowstone, visit the Blackfoot Indian Reservation at Browning, Mont., and camp in Glacier National Park before reaching Waterton Lakes National Park in Canada. Still heading north they will attend the Calgary Stampede, biggest rodeo in Canada, and then camp, fish, and hike in the Canadian Rockies. In Alaska they will stop at Juneau, Wrangell, and Ketchikan, visit gold mines and glaciers, and watch salmon fight their way up-stream. Upon arrival at Seattle, the camp will head for the Washington coast for surfing. From the coast the group will head eastward, stopping to see the great Bonneville Dam on the Columbia River and camping in Wallawa National Forest in Oregon. They will visit Snake River Canyon between Oregon and Idaho and will stop at Salt Lake City. There will also be a stop at Rocky Mountain National Park in Colorado before starting home. The camp will cover a period of nine weeks.
