All the scoring came in three innings. Hazelwood jumped into the lead in the bottom of the first with two runs, then followed through with a seven-run spurge in the sixth.

That was the clincher, but it nearly wasn't for the Pigeons fought back in the top of the eighth, scoring all their runs before their rally was nipped.

Hazelwood's scoring in the big sixth came on five hits, two errors and a walk.

The late Canton rally produced the seven runs on five hits and two errors.

Hazelwood jumped into an early 4-to-0 lead but the Maryville nine rallied to knot the count in the eighth and scored the winning run in the ninth on a triple and single to right field.
