

DDT Found Dangerous For Use on Cows

LINCOLN, Neb. (UP)—The insecticide DDT is dangerous when used on some animals, according to University of Nebraska entomologists. They recommended farmers discontinue using the chemical on livestock, particularly dairy cattle. Cows sprayed with DDT absorb or lick off the insecticide, which then is excreted in milk fat and stored in the fatty tissue of beef animals, the scientists said. New chemicals — DDD and DDMT, closely related to DDT — are "less likely" to be absorbed, according to the entomologists. DDT is not overruled or outmoded, they said, "but we believe other chemicals to be safer" in livestock use.
