Amateur Night Set For White Oak Thursday

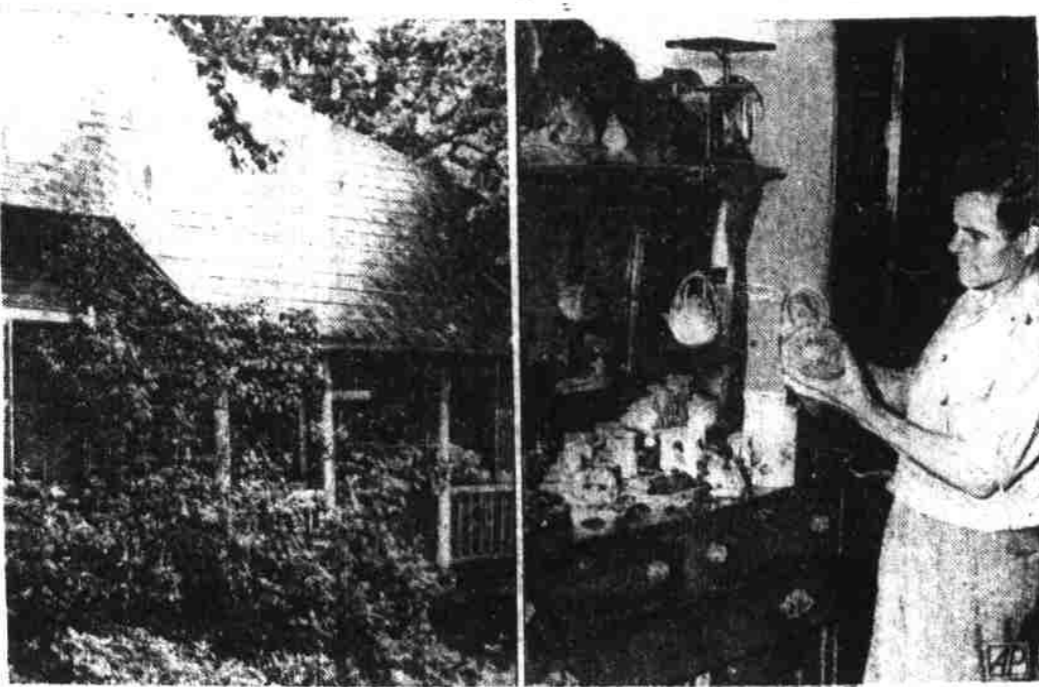

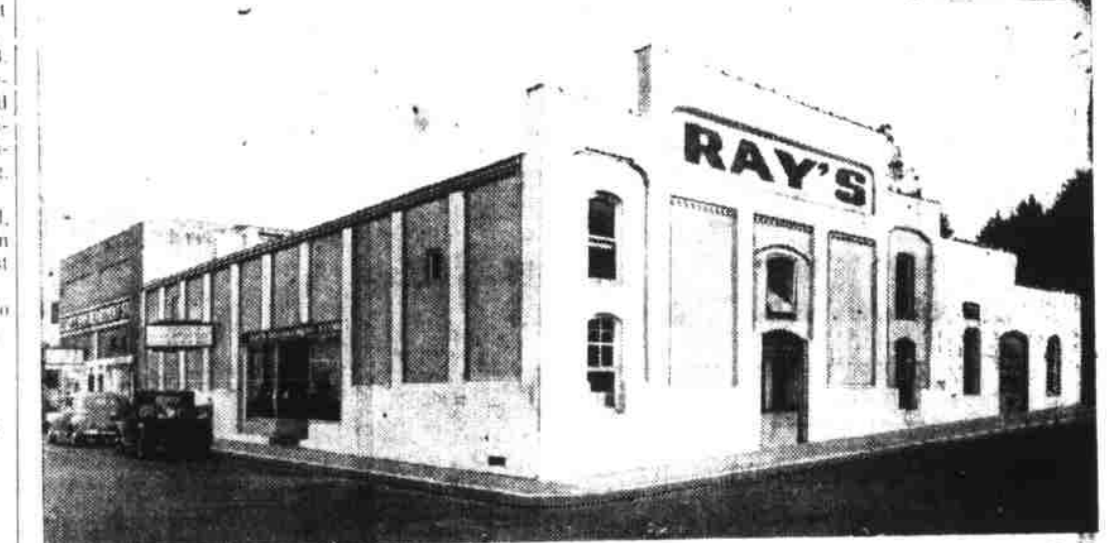
