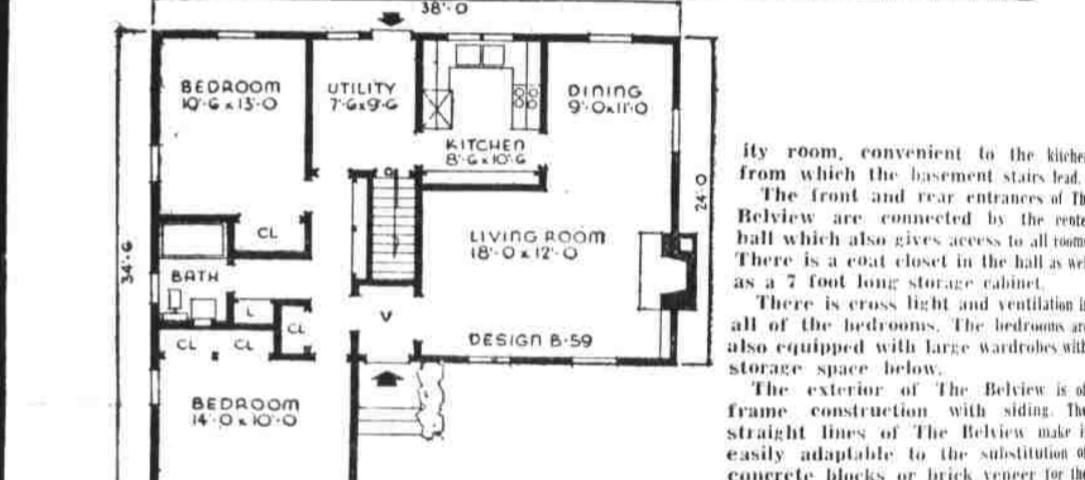
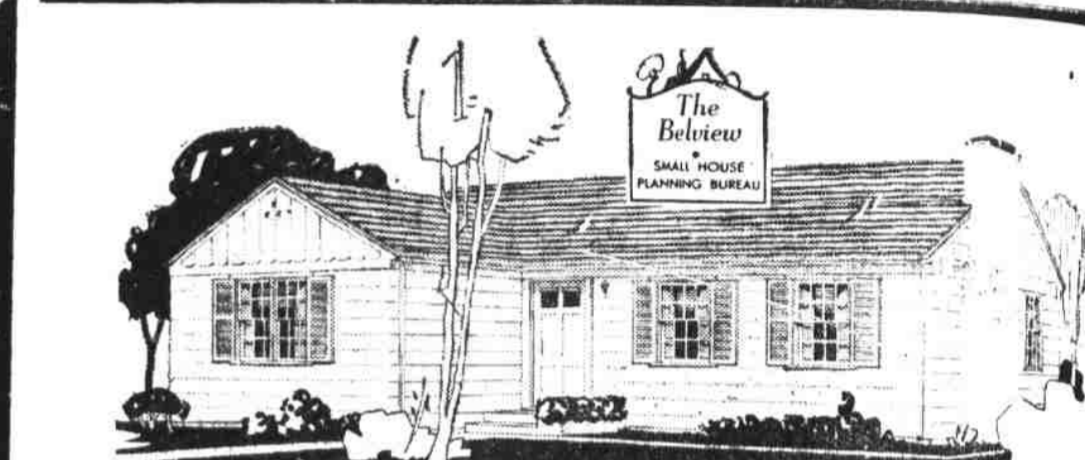
Maggie Boys Fined For Slaying Pet Bear

Two Maggie boys must pay fines and damages for killing J. T. Bradley's trained pet bear. Judge Dan K. Moore last Monday sentenced Jack Setzer and Floyd Fle each to 12 months imprisonment, suspended on condition they pay Mr. Bradley \$200 each for the loss of his bear, and pay fines of \$100 each.

He also placed them on probation for five years. The boys had pleaded nolo contendere (no defense) to charges of cruelty to animals and malicious destruction of personal property. The bear was taken out of his cage the night of July 9, shot to death, then mutilated and thrown on a mountainside.
