ments Mr. Dyer has made and showed the group his field of tobacco.

The group then went to the Ed Sams farm to look at his modern dairy barn and to observe the pasture work which he has done in the past few years.

Mr. Sams has an outstanding Ladino clover and orchard grass pasture which he obtained by liming the land and fertilizing at the rate of 100 to 800 pounds of 2-12-12 and seeding at the rate of 2 pounds of Ladino clover and 12 pounds of orchard grass per acre.

It was also brought out here the value of clipping pastures, and Mr. Sams was clipping part of his pastures during the tour.

He also showed the group his herd of dairy cattle, stating that some of the cows in this herd are giving over a tone of milk per month from this type of pasture.

The group then went to the C. T. Francis farm to see some outstanding Hereford cattle. Mr. Francis had his herd sire and the son of this sire out for the group to look at—also six or eight calves from his herd sire. Mr. Francis owns some of the outstanding Hereford cattle in this area, and it is very evident that his breeding program is paying off from the looks of his calves. Then Ted Francis, 4-H Club member and son of Mr. Francis, showed the group his baby beef which is also a son of the herd sire.

At the Jack Felmet farm, Mr. and Mrs. Felmet showed them through their home. There they saw some extensive home improvement projects, including a water system from their spring.

Mr. and Mrs. Felmet served cold drinks to the entire group at this stop.

The next stop was at Bob Francis' farm, where Mr. Francis showed the group some outstanding corn, also an improved pasture and some soil conservation work which

From here the group went to the Ratcliffe Cove Community Cemetery where Mr. Francis spoke to the group on the improvements which had been made on the cemetery.

At the Hardy Limer farm they saw an outstanding field of tobacco and also went to the Hub Francis farm to see his tobacco. Then they went to the Hugh Ratcliffe farm to see some more good Hereford cattle.

Mr. Ratcliffe emphasized that he is using a purebred bull, breeding to grade Hereford females and saving the good female calves for replacements. The group also saw some good steers there, all of which points to the fact that good cattle and pastures go hand-in-hand.

The next stop was at the modern home and farm of Mr. and Mrs. D. Reeves Noland. There the group was shown the dairy, which is run by Peggy and David Noland, 4-H Club members, and a hay-drier in the barn for curing their alfalfa hay. The group was also shown an outstanding Ladino clover and orchard grass pasture, and then were taken through the modern home of Mr. and Mrs. Noland.

From there everyone went to the Ratcliffe Cove Baptist church, where dinner was served to the group by the women of Ratcliffe Cove Community. After a beautiful lunch, the group assembled in front of the church for group singing which was led by Charles Liles. Besides the competition between these two communities in group singing, quartettes were entered in competition. Iron Duff and Ratcliffe Cove tied for first place in the group singing, and Iron Duff won on their quartette.
