Asheville. The concert is one of a series being given in western North Carolina and South Carolina this season.

Among the featured soloists are William Heas, tenor, and Shirley Ann Givens, violinist.

The orchestra's concertmaster is Leo Farnesvich, who holds the same position with the famed Ballet Russe de Monte Carlo in New York during the winter season. Norman Lamb, principal violist with the National Symphony during the winter, plays this instrument with the Faculty Orchestra. Mr. Lamb is assistant conductor of the Transylvania Symphony.

Other members of the orchestra which will play here tonight include Ignatius Grimsa, National Symphony clarinetist; Raymond Ojeda, baritone formerly with the San Francisco Philharmonic; Nathan Jones, flutist from the University of Michigan; John Mack, oboist of the Curtis School of Music, Philadelphia; Carolyn Clarke Pinesvich, first horn player of the Ballet Russe orchestra and head of the woodwind section; John Gesling, of the Juillard School of Music, who plays first trumpet; Warren Benion of the University of Michigan, playing percussion; and Paul Besan, alumnus of the University of Michigan, who plays the trombone.

The program shows these selections:

Orchestral: Overture—La Vie Parisienne on theme by Offenbach; Schubert—Andante con moto from Symphony No. 5 in B flat major; Handel's Where Did You Walk From? from the opera Alcibiade; Marche from Suite Algerienne, by Saint-Saens; Nocturne and Wedding March from A Mid-Summer Night's Dream, by Mendelssohn; Sarsate's Zigeunerweisen (Gypsy airs), played by Mrs. Givens, with Harold Mathews, an accompanist; variation on the theme "Pop! Go!"; The Waltz arranged by Lucien Cailliet and Strauss' beautiful Blue Danube Waltz.

Many of these players will be members of the orchestra which will play for the Fourth Annual Brevard Music Festival, which will be held August 12-14 and August 19-21. During this period, the first complete performance in the Southeast of the Beethoven Ninth (Choral) Symphony will be given.

These are the teachers who instruct talented young school musicians at the famed camp near Brevard. Now attending the camp is a large group of boys and girls who are members of the Waynesville Township High School Band.

Thursday of the convocation will bring to the forefront the affairs of the Assembly, including a meeting of the 46-member Board of Trustees, under the presidency of Edwin L. Jones of Charlotte. Valuable Barn

it as a recreation center this month.

Though the news of the loss came as a great shock, he said, he felt tremendously relieved when he learned his five horses escaped injury.

He said that they came in and out of the barn as they pleased, since he did not lock them in, but that he had heard that horses run forward fire.

The firemen found them huddled together in a corner of the pasture, safe from the flames.

Judge Anderson said the barn was so constructed that an auto could be driven up to the second floor. He added he had estimated there was space enough for 16 efficiency apartments.

After reviewing his loss, the judge said:

"I haven't lost faith in this part of the country. I still may build a home here and intend to keep investing."

He made his first visit to Haywood 20 years ago, and has been spending his summers here regularly for the last three years.

Chief Fitzgerald said the firemen avoided pouring water into the blazing barn in order to prevent the concrete and stone foundations from cracking by sudden cooling. He explained that the building was virtually destroyed when the firemen reached it.

He added that the person who phoned in the alarm at approximately 4:30 a. m. had said that the building had been burning from 20 to 30 minutes at the time, and erroneously described it as the Axlens Creek Grocery, which is three-quarters of a mile from the barn.

Since there are no water lines in that area, firemen pumped water from a nearby creek to save the burning tool shed.
