It Took Only 10 Minutes, Atom Scientist Says

ANN ARBOR, Mich. (U. P. Press) - A new stunt on the order of the universe took only 10 minutes to create the 96 elements, a scientist thinks.

Dr. Gerson Gamow, nuclear physicist from George Washington University, believes that 3,000,000-000 years ago the first atomic neutron began to fall down and create the elements, which formed atoms.

The action he said was set off by a slow cooling of the compact mass of what was then the universe. At first the rapid temperature, Gamow said, the nuclear building process began.

Ten minutes later the 96 elements were created.

But the universe was still composed of vapor Gamow believes, and the vapors continued to cool. Thirty million years later they condensed into clouds and eventually became stars and suns.

The planets are by-products of the suns, he added.

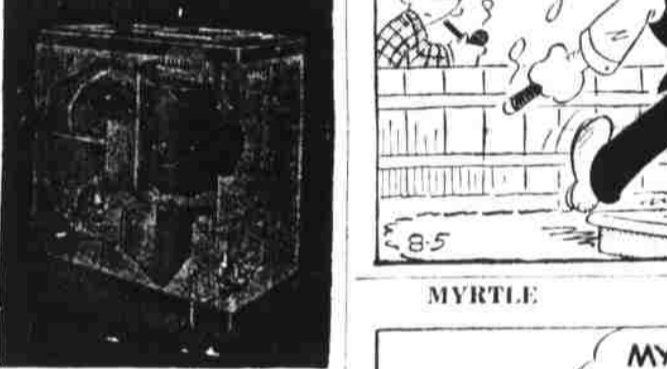
