There were neat little tricks with fruit. Unhulled strawberries, moistened in pineapple or orange juice and arranged about a mound of powdered sugar, provide a different touch. Stewed fresh fruits with toast or hot breads are good. A summer breakfast of chilled fruit juice, then berries and cream, toasted brioche, mayhap some grilled ham, and coffee is superlative eating, and not too expensive.

Hot Breads With all the quick mixes available, it is easy enough to run up some special hot breads or rolls. Or invest in some baker's buns, slice, toast lightly on one side, butter and sprinkle with sugar and cinnamon, then put in a warm oven to blend. There's an inexpensive but beautiful breakfast treat.
