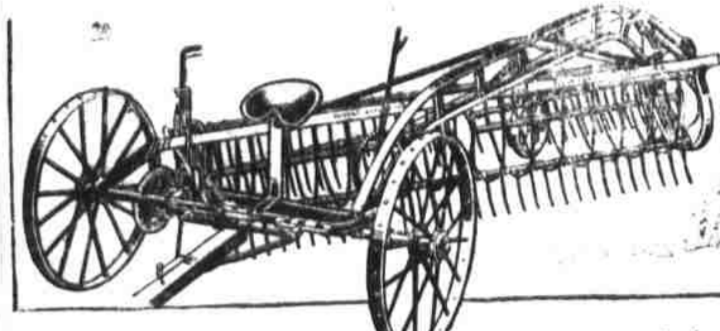
Health Office Offers Exams To School Teachers
