NOTICE HAYWOOD COUNTY HOSPITAL BOND AND TAX ELECTION

A special election will be held in Haywood County on Saturday the first day of October 1949, at the same places at which the last election was held in said County for members of the General Assembly between 6:30 o'clock A. M. and 6:30 o'clock P. M. Eastern Standard Time for the purpose of submitting to the voters the question (1) whether they will approve the order finally passed by the County Commissioners on August 22, 1949 authorizing \$225,000 bonds of the County for the purpose of erecting an addition to the County Hospital and the levy and collection of a tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest thereof, and (2) whether they will authorize the levy and collection of an annual tax in addition to all other taxes at the rate of ten cents on each \$100 of the assessed valuation of the County for the purpose of financing the cost of operation, equipment and maintenance of the County Hospital.

The said election shall be held under the direction of the County Board of Elections of Haywood County, the precincts and the polling places shall be as heretofore established by said Board of Elections, and the Registrar and Judges for holding said election shall be as designated and appointed by said Board of Elections.

The registration books shall be opened on the 3rd day of September, and closed on the 17th day of September, 1949, according to law. This the 22nd day of August 1949.

Pursuant to an order of the Board of Commissioners of Haywood County ordering a special election as hereinafter set forth it is ordered by the Board of Elections of Haywood County that a special election shall be held in Haywood County on Saturday, the 1st day of October, 1949, at the same places at which the last election was held in said County for members of the General Assembly between 6:30 o'clock A. M. and 6:30 o'clock P. M. 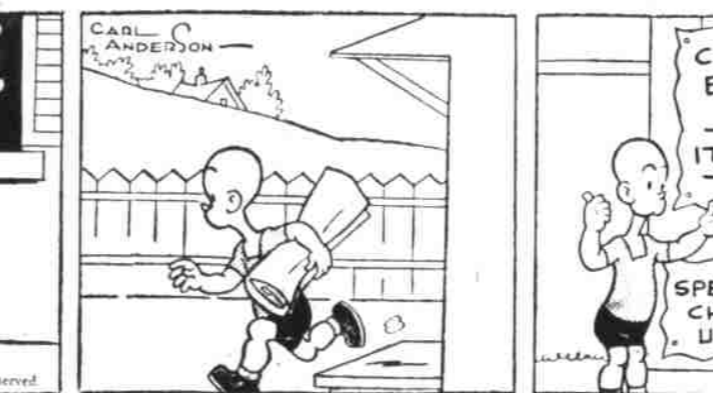
