open into the central hall, insuring free circulation.  
The fireplace in front of the Carter forms one side of the entrance recess. The wide eave overhang protects both the entrance door and the corner windows. Between the fireplace and the corner a handy cabinet for magazines or other items, is built-in to window sill height.  
The Carter's plans call for brick or stone veneer on the front, up to and including the chimney. The balance of the house is planned for frame with siding finish. Because of its straight wall lines, this plan is also adaptable to concrete block construction.  
The Carter is 36 feet by 28 feet with an area of 1,039 square feet and a volume of 21,321 cubic feet.
