The members of the West Pigeon Community Development Club last Tuesday night heard Joe Davis, vice-president of the First National Bank of Waynesville, urge support of the proposed hospital bond issue.

Mr. Davis told a representative audience meeting at the Bethel School that the Haywood County Hospital needs space and must be expanded to take care of the patients who have grown rapidly in numbers over the past years.

"A larger hospital," he said, "is necessary for the betterment of Haywood County as a whole."

The election to determine whether the voters want the bonds issued as their share of the state and federal hospital aid program will be held October 1.

During the meeting also, the members of the organization unanimously voted to throw their support behind Bethel High School's efforts to organize a football team.

They also voted to reinforce this support by contributing at least \$100 to the cost of football equipment.

They also discussed plans for putting up better mail boxes and erecting signs bearing the names of farm owners at each of the farms.

The organization's regular meeting will be held tomorrow night for the discussion of further plans for community improvement.
