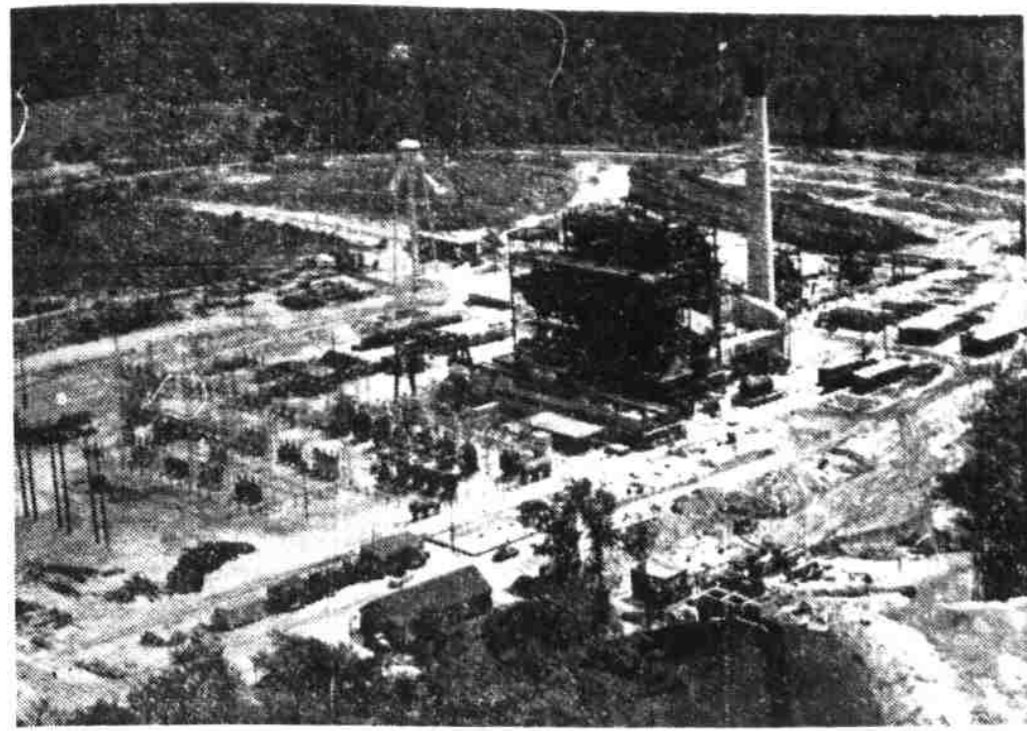


New Power For The Carolinas



Latest instrument for development of the Carolinas is this 120,000-horse-power steam electric generating plant at Lenoir, which will be put in service by the Carolina Power & Light Co. September 30th. The first 100,000-kw. unit of the plant, which is a similar unit and a similar unit is being installed. The Lenoir plant is part of a \$200,000,000 expansion program underway by CP&L. It will provide over 740,000,000 kilowatt-hours of electricity per year, enough to serve over 300,000 average residences.

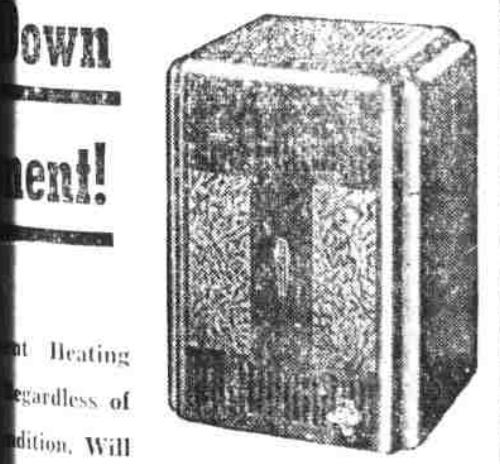

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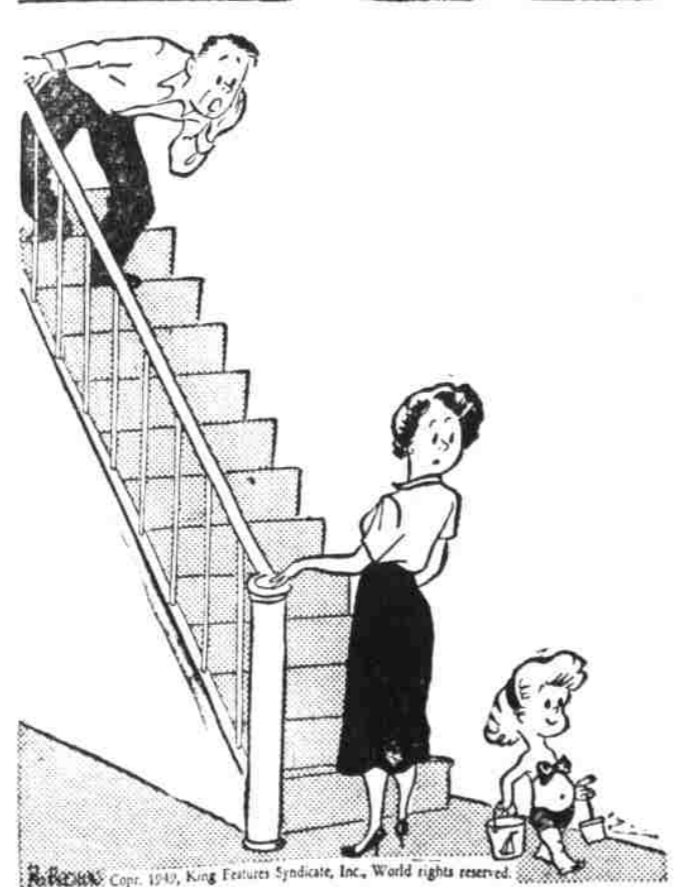
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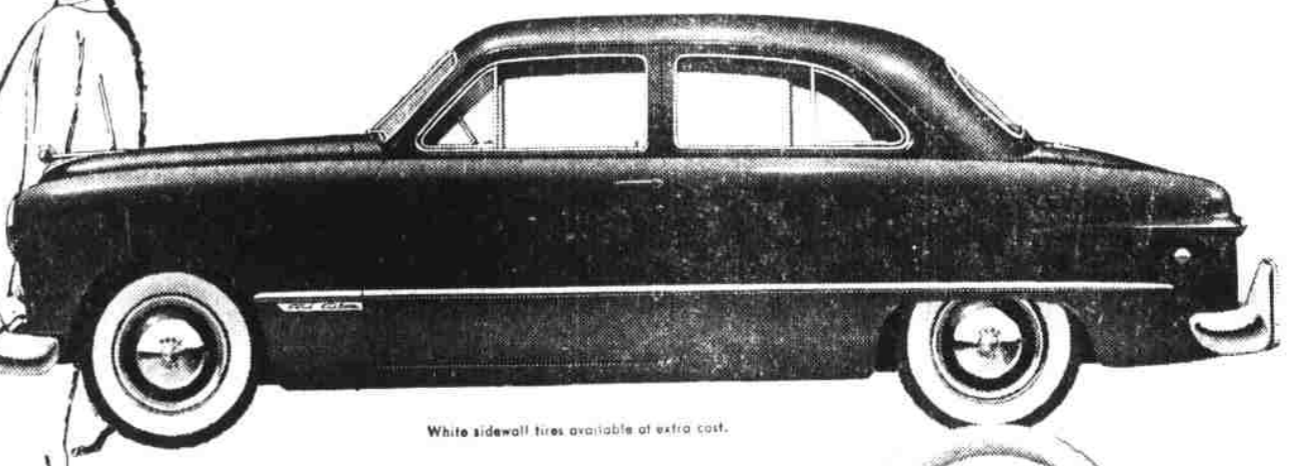
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
