APPOINTED BY JEHOVAH TO PROPHECY

Scripture—Isaiah 6.

The seraphim are sinless creatures who offer unceasing worship to God.

"Then said I, woe is me! for I am undone; because I am a man of unclean lips, and I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips; for mine eyes have seen the King, the Lord of Hosts."

"Then flew one of the seraphim unto me, having a live coal in his hand, which he had taken with the tongs from the altar; and he laid it upon my mouth, and said, Lo, this hath touched thy lips; and thine iniquity is taken away, and thy sin purged."

"In the earthly sanctuary the burning of incense was performed by taking coals from the altar of burnt offering and pouring them on the altar of incense, and then upon these was scattered the incense." There was no burnt offering on this altar.

"Also I heard the voice of the Lord, saying, Whom shall I send, and who will go for us? Then said I, Here am I; send me."

Uplifted by the thought that his sins were forgiven and he was worthy to do the Lord's will,

and his reign had been a happy and prosperous one. Now the throne was vacant, and forebodings of trouble were rife.

Uzziah died in 734 B. C., and in the succeeding years, when Isaiah was prophesying, Rome was founded.

It was a time for people to repent of their sinful way of living, to turn to righteousness and to correct the abuses in the government of their land.

It has been said of this chapter in Isaiah, that it "stands unrivaled in the Old Testament, both for grandeur of conception and the majestic simplicity of its style."

The reader will be reminded forcibly of St. John's Revelation, and should re-read the latter.

(Above it (the throne) stood the seraphim, each one was covered with six wings; with twain he covered his face, and with twain he covered his feet, and with twain he did fly.

"And one cried unto another, and said, Holy, holy, holy, is the Lord of Hosts, the whole earth is full of His glory."

Baptists At Hazelwood Having Banner Attendance

To Hold Revival



REV. WALTER ZVODA, lecturer and evangelist of Asheville, will begin a series of meetings at the Dellwood church on Sunday, October 2nd, at 7:30. The meetings will be held each night at the same hour through October 8th, according to Rev. George McHaffey, pastor of the church. Rev. Mr. Zvoda has traveled in Palestine, and will include some sacred scenes from Jerusalem. A cordial welcome is extended to all to attend these meetings.

Rev. M. L. Lewis to explain the Hazelwood Baptist church is leading into another good year. With an average attendance of 292 for the month of September, Mr. Lewis feels that this will be one of the great years of the church. A look at the average attendance shows that the church is growing in interest and attendance. In the year 1945 the church reached an average attendance of 116 per Sunday in Sunday School. In 1946 the low year of 103, but 1947 saw the wheel start turning with 121. In 1948 that figure climbed to 162 and the past year that has just been completed, the attendance held up to 124. Comparing the average for September over a period of years, Mr. Lewis at the 1949 is looking for better. In 1945 the average attendance of the Sunday School was 96 in 1946 this was 131, in 1947, 152, with last year's average being 157. "It helps to know that this month's average was 292," says the pastor.

Not only the Sunday School but the other phases of the work are making progress. With Jarvis Brock as new Educational Director, doing a very fine week the choir is equal to any in the county, said the pastor. Our Training Union and W. M. S. are working smoothly and joyfully. The spirit of the work in general is fine as the pastor. The church membership has grown 50 in less than 3 years. We also were instrumental in conducting a Mission Sunday School, which has become the "Green Valley Baptist church" with 71 members, and Dr. M. L. Lewis as its pastor. This school has over 100 in attendance each Sunday. In the last 3 years the church has built an Educational Building at the cost of \$24,000. On the new building, \$4,000 remains to be paid on the building. The future of the church is when they can erect a new sanctuary that will be a credit to the city.

Hazelwood Churches Note Big Increase In Sunday School Attendance Goals

In March of this year the Hazelwood ministers from the Baptist, Methodist, Church of God and Presbyterian, launched a three months attendance, "Go to Church" campaign. Looking back now over the months, they find that the crusade was a great success not only that it boomed the attendance these months, but that the attendance is still going and growing.

Here are the statistics concerning the increase. In February of this year, the churches had a total attendance (that is averaging the month) of 363 per Sunday.

In March the attendance climbed to 406 average each Sunday. April rose to 488, May jumped to 509 and June the closing month the outstanding figure of 541.

These figures show an increase of 177 over the period. But that is not all of the story.

September found the churches still going strong with 520 average attendance for the month. And

yet there is a far greater outlook for the last Sunday of the month of September found 561 people in Sunday School in these churches.
