N.C. Patrolmen To Chase Speeders

RALEIGH (AP) — Despite criticism, state highway patrolmen will continue to chase speeders, who attempt to escape at breakneck speeds, Col. C. R. Tolar, patrol commander, said today.

A number of newspapers have questioned the wisdom of having patrolmen risk their lives to catch speeders. "If a patrolman was killed near Asheville, it would be a tragedy," he said.

In a letter to the General Merchandise column in the Charlotte Observer, Tolar wrote:

"It would be an invitation for every speeder to buy a car and knock the patrolman would not chase them."

"The fact is, in a patrolman's opinion, speeders are a pest. They are a danger to the general public and that it is his duty to chase them out of all costs."

Patrolmen Are Gunning For Plastic Birds

RALEIGH — (AP) — The bird-hunting season is opening early for state highway patrolmen.

Patrol Commander C. R. Tolar said his men are going after those little plastic birds—'lucky travelers,' they're called—which motorists have been installing on their windshields.

Tolar pointed out that State law prohibits motorists from carrying anything on their windshields, or windows, except state-authorized stickers.

The birds will get attention from the patrolmen two nights of this week when they set up road blocks throughout the state for safety-checks of cars.

Motorists with the "lucky travelers" will be unlucky travelers, Tolar warned, because they'll be cited to court.
