Squirrel, Grouse Season Opens In Pisgah Forest

Squirrel and grouse hunting in Pisgah National Forest became legal from October 3 through the 15th, Ranger William Duncan has announced.

Outside of the forest, the squirrel season opened last Saturday, October 1. Ranger Duncan says that there will be two checking stations in the forest, one at White Pine for the Avery Creek section, and the other at the mouth of Looking Glass creek for that area above.

Hunters will be permitted to the area on purchase of a \$1.00 special permit, and no limit will be placed on the number of participating hunters. Only recognized breeds of bird dogs will be allowed on the hunt, and hunters will be required to check in and out of the hunting area. Two grouse and six squirrels will be allowed each hunter per day. However, the general two days' possession limit will apply.

The regulation also requires that hunters must be 16 years of age and possess a valid state hunting license.
