A Touch of Texas on the Table

Here's a new recipe for one of the good old standbys for fall appetites: baked beans. It's a little "hotter" than the usual rule, and the beans are cooked for only three hours, rather than overnight as usual.

TEXAS BAKED BEANS

Ingredients: 4 cups dry navy beans, 1/2 cup salt pork, 1 cup dark molasses, 2 small onions, chopped, 1 teaspoon dry mustard, 1 tablespoon salt, 1/4 teaspoon pepper, 2 tablespoons chili powder, 1 cup boiling water, drained, strained beans.

Method: Wash beans, pick over and soak for 2 hours in boiling water to cover. Cover, bring to boil in sauce, reduce to simmer, and cook for 2 hours, adding water as needed to cover well. 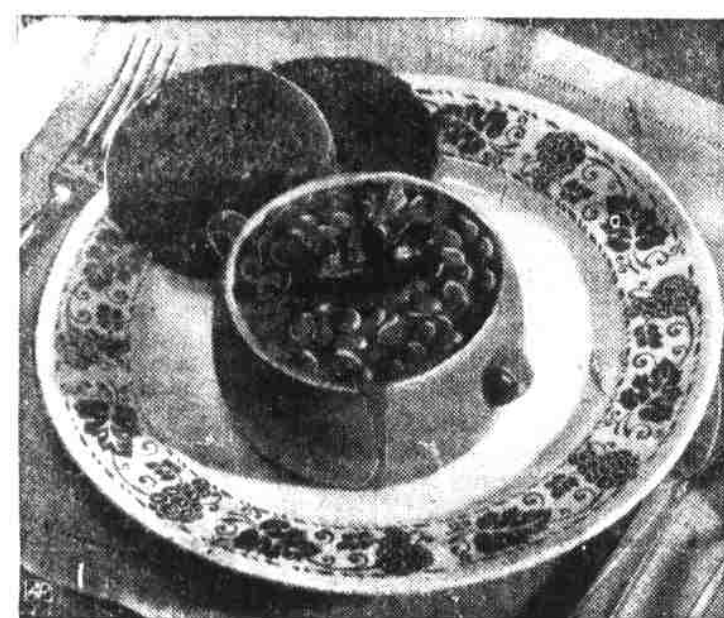
