

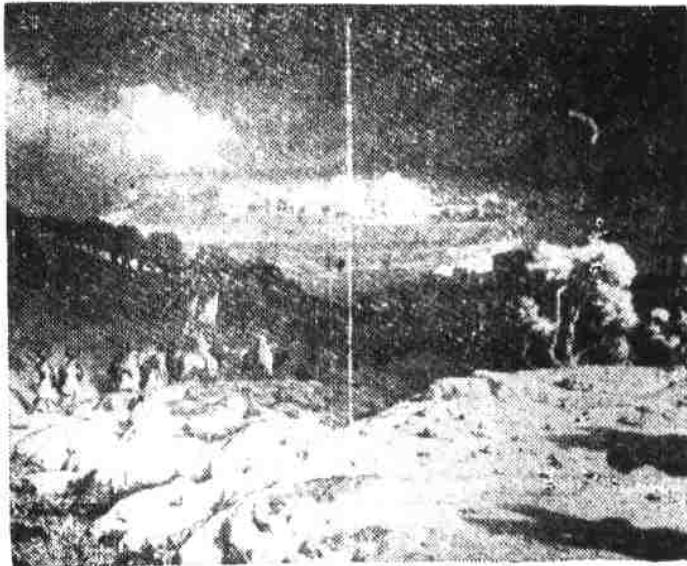

Anvil Chorus Greets Queen On Birthday

NEW WESTMINSTER, B. C. (U.P.)—This city uses good old-fashioned anvils, not sleek 25-pound guns to fire royal salutes when Queen Victoria's birthday rolls around. It's an old custom dating back to 1872 when members of the original "Ancient and Honourable Anvil Battery" gathered to fire the first 21-bang anvil chorus in honor of the Queen.

They really used anvils. New Westminster did not have guns then.

It's an old Cheshire custom — that of filling the square hole in the top of the anvil with gunpowder, placing another one on top, and setting the charge off with a red-hot iron. The resulting "bang" was loud enough to fool anyone. The novel gun is fired at one minute intervals, 21 times.

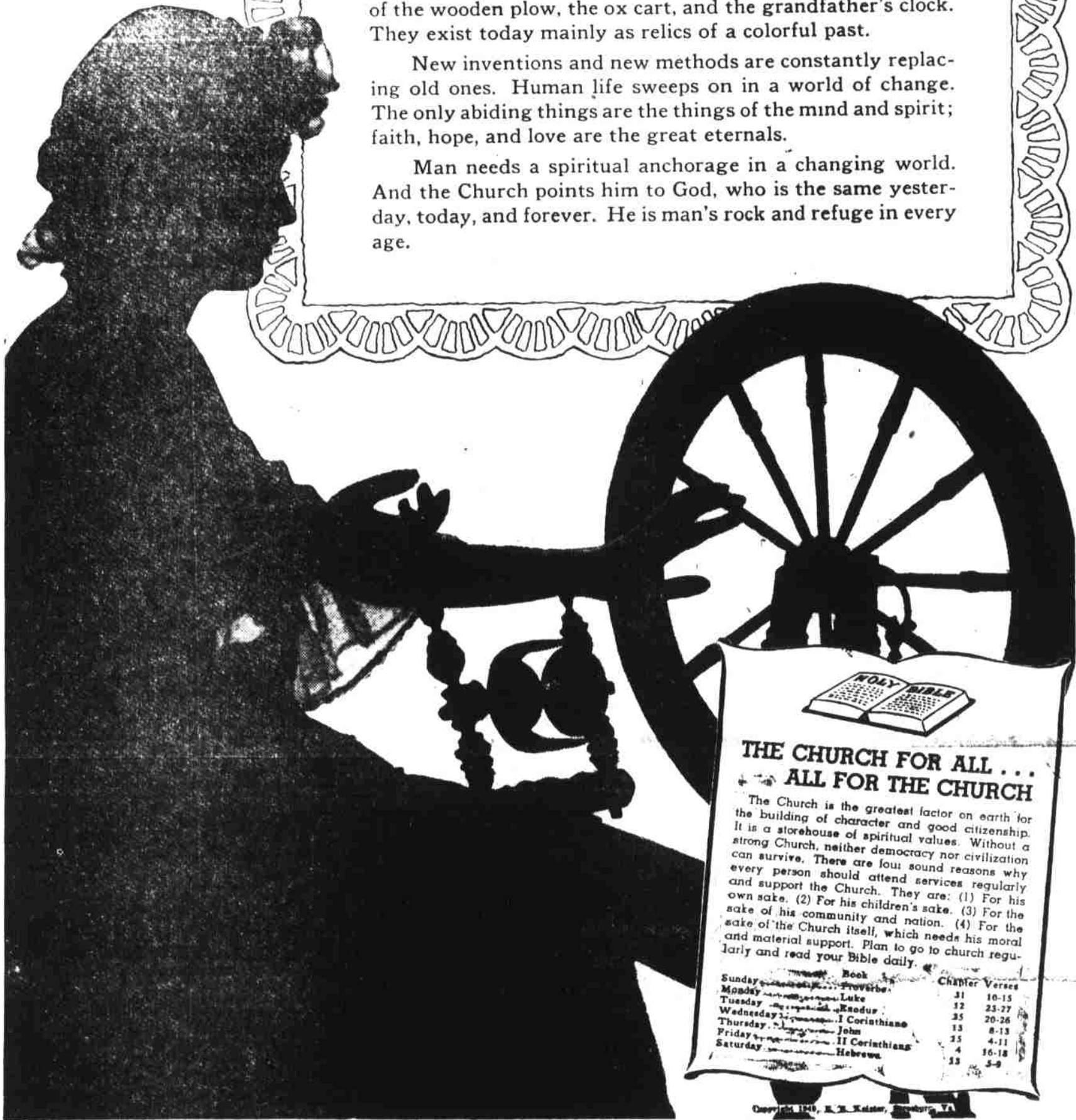
IN GRANDMA'S DAY
