The chartering of a new corporaion last week opened a movement to expand the University of North Carolina's journalism department into a School of Journalism.

The new non-profit corporation chartered by North Carolina Secre tary of State, Thad Eure, is the Journalism Foundation of North Carolina, Inc.

The Foundation of 110 charter members, including W. C. Russ, editor of the Mountaineer, immediately launched a campaign to raise \$100,000 for an endowment to expand the journalism depart-

ment into the proposed new school Within a short time after the drive started, the first donors gave \$1,000 each and the will of the late W. Carey Dowd, Jr., former Charlotte News published set aside more

than \$5,000 for the foundation. The new organization was initiated by the North Carolina Press Association.

Its charter members are eminent publishers, radio executives, writers, and public officials both in and out of the state.

The names include those of Senators Frank P. Graham and Clyde R. Hoey, Secretary of the Army Gordon Gray, who is publisher of the Winston-Salem Journal-Sentinel; and Washington Columnist Drew Pearson, among others.
