WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Haywood County School other 8 sources combined. It is Administrative Unit has determinalso interesting to note that dur- ed that it is necessary to provide the additional school facilities in said unit, described in Section 1 of this bond order, in order that the public schools in said County may be maintained, as a part of the system of public schools of the State of North Carolina, for the term required by the Constitution of North Carolina, and that it will be necessary to expend for such purposes not less than \$25,000, in addition to other available funds and has requested the Board of Commissioners to issue bonds of the County of Haywood to finance

> BE IT ORDERED by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Haywood as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Commissioners of the County of Haywood has ascertained and hereby determines that it is necessary that the Haywood County School Administrative Unit erect new school buildings or additions to existing school buildings and to alter or reconstruct existing school buildings, and to acquire land and purchase furnishings and equipment required for such buildings or additions, in order that the public schools of said County may be maintained, as a part of the system of public schools of the State of North Carolina, for the term required by the Constitution of North Carolina, and that it will be necessary to expend for said purposes not less than \$25,000, in addition to other available funds.

Section 2. In order to raise the money required to finance the erection of such new school buildings or additions to existing school buildings and to alter or reconstruct existing school buildings and the acquisition of such land and the purchase of such furnishings and equipment, bonds of the County of Haywood are hereby authorized and shall be issued pursuant to The County Finance Act of North Carolina. The maximum aggregate principal amount of said bonds authorized by this bond order shall be Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000). No debt shall be contracted during any fiscal year by the issuance of bonds pursuant to this order if the amount of such debt and of all other debt contracted during such fiscal year shall exceed two-thirds of the amount by which the out-standing indebtedness of said County shall have been reduced Bookmobile Schedule

D. J. Noland moved that the bond order be approved and that a public hearing thereon shall be held on the 2nd day of January. 1950, at 10:00 o'clock in the forenoon at the regular meeting room of the Board of Commissioners at courthouse, in Waynesville, North Carolina, and that the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners be directed to publish the bond order with a notice of hearing in the form prescribed by law. adopted. D. J. Noland moved that the County Accountant be designated

as the officer to file with the Clerk of the Board the statement of debt which must be filed under The County Finance Act, prior to the hearing on the bond order. The motion was seconded by J. R. Hipps and was unanimously adopted.

The foregoing bond order has been introduced and a sworn statement has been filed under the County Finance Act, showing the assessed valuation of the County to be \$30,647,834, and the net debt for school purposes, including the proposed bonds, to be \$657,325. A tax will be levied for the payment of the proposed bonds and interest, if the same shall be issued. Any citizen or taxpayer may protest against the issuance of such bonds at a meeting of the Board of Commissioners to be held at the regular meeting place of said Board in the Courthouse in Waynesville, North Carolina, at 10:00 o'clock, A.
