Gospel Is for All Men, Saith the Lord

ALL NATIONS TO BE CONVERTED BY APOSTLES

Scripture—Acts 8:4-11:18.
NEWMAN CAMPBELL
 BEFORE JESUS' Ascension, told His apostles to "make disciples of all the nations." This was a new idea to the Jews, who accepted the Gospel of Christ their exclusive own. It took time and several object lessons to convince them that the Gospel was for all men every-where.
 In the modern world, mission-ary journey far over the whole globe to bring this message to people of far-off lands. Mil-lions hear the word of God become Christians.

Jerusalem. In the way, however, he was confronted with a vision of Jesus, who asked, "Saul, Saul, why per-secutes thou Me?" Trembling and astonished, Saul asked the Lord what he should do, and was told to go on to Damascus and he would receive further instruction.
 The vision had blinded Saul, so he had to be led by the hand to the city. For three days he was blind, and he ate and drank nothing. Then Ananias, a de-vout man, came to him, and he was baptized. Then Ananias, who had been the bitter, re-vengeful enemy of the early church, became its fearless exponent. Ananias, Philip was preach-ing the Gospel, led by the Lord's hand. There, in a desert place, he saw an Ethiopian—such a man of great author-ity in the service of Queen Can-thera of that country.
 The eunuch was reading the book of Isaiah, and Philip asked him if he knew whereof he read. The eunuch asked for instruction, and he expounded it to him, con-vincing him.
 They travel far abroad in the comparatively limited boundaries of the old world in this lesson. The scene now shifts to three ter-ranean cities—Lydda, Jop-
