

WMA Program Getting Off Good Start In County, Says Chairman Ferguson

Community committeemen of the Extension and Marketing Administration are already at work in Haywood County collecting the information necessary to carry out the Conservation Program it announced today by A. W. Ferguson, Chairman of the Haywood County PMA Committee.

Ferguson stated that the program is off to a good start and that the county is generally showing a cooperative attitude.

"There is one point I would like to stress to the farmers to keep in mind," Ferguson said. "When the conservation program gets around to your place, the things he is going to do with you is your conservation for the next few years. He will also list the crops and conservation measures you have completed during the last year. It is not too difficult for a farmer to recall just what he has done, but when you start planning for the future, sometimes it is difficult to do with the correct answer."

Local PMA leader went on to point out that if the farmer does a little thinking about conservation needs before the extension man visits his farm, time could be saved for both farmer and the committeeman. He said that if the farm operator is thinking about future conservation in terms of acres of tree seedlings to plant, acres of woodland to be planted in a selective manner, of potash, phosphate, or fertilizer to be used in seeding legumes, or acres to be renovated, it would be much worthwhile.

"Believe me, the chairman said, the farmer's greatest savings is that he doesn't need to do the business men, and to be careless in this regard a farm should be planned as

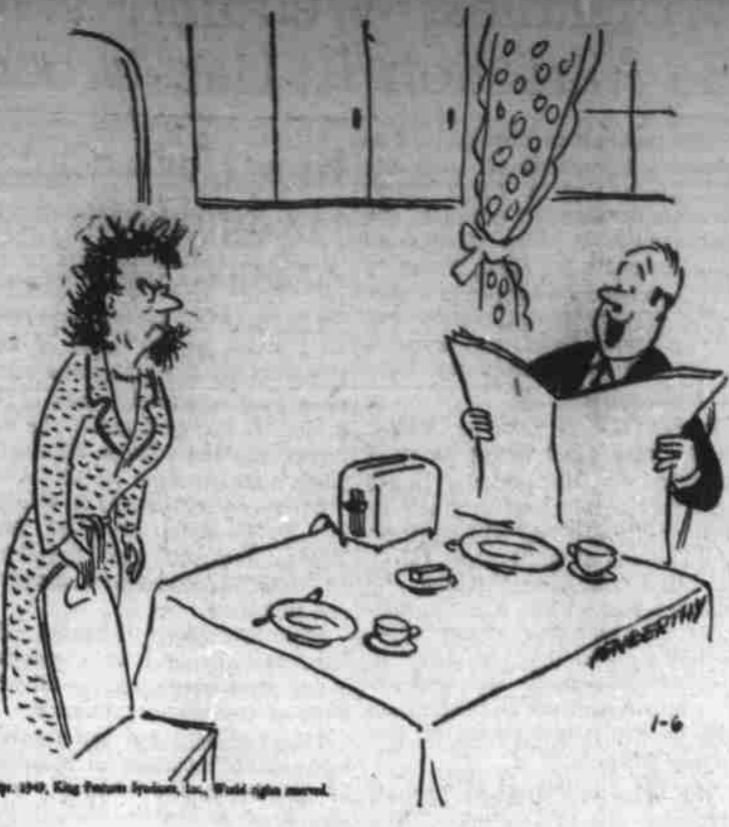
The delegates will hold a luncheon at 1 p.m. at the Towne House before going on to the Court House.

List Your Property Give In Your Poll Before Feb. 15

All property owners and taxpayers in Haywood County are required to return to the list takers for Taxation for the year 1950 all the Real Estate, Personal Property, etc., which each shall own on the First day of January.

All male persons between the ages of 21 and 50 are required to list their polls during the same time.

All persons who own property and fail to list it and all who are liable for poll tax and fail to give themselves in will be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor.
