Such pranks also consume valuable time of reporters, as they investigate such articles for the truth.

Since this is the second time this has happened in about a year, it seems that it is time to prosecute the guilty parties, and make an example of them to would-be-offenders. (The young couple pulling this latest prank should have known better.)
