When they had chosen seven and the men were standing before the apostles—Stephen, Philip, Prochorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas and Nicolas (all Greeks), the apostles "laid their hands on them and prayed," dedicating them to the work.
So carefully and democratically the founders of the Christian church chose their ministers in the very beginning.
Paul, writing to Timothy, who was at Ephesus, in after years, advised him of the necessity of selecting men of good moral character—not drunkards, nor polygamists, nor money lovers—to serve as bishops and deacons in the organizing of their churches. He even mentioned the wives of these officers of the church: "Even so must their wives be grave, not slanderers, sober, faithful in all things."
Such, according to St. Paul, was the type of man and wife to become leaders of the church of God. The advice is as pertinent today as it was then.
