\$15,000 in Back Pensions Awaits Union's Ex-Head

CHICAGO (UP)—The AFL Meat Cutters and Butcher Workmen's Union wants to get in touch with Michael Donnelly to give him \$15,000 in back pensions. Patrick E. Gorman, the union's secretary-treasurer, said Donnelly, a former president of the union, was last heard from six years ago at San Francisco.

Donnelly, now in his 70's, was president of the union from 1898 to 1905. In 1904 he led the union on its first general national strike. In a subsequent strike Donnelly was beaten, Gorman said, and the union was out of touch with him from 1905 to 1916, when he turned up at Fort Worth, Tex.

So far is known, Gorman said, he has no living relatives. Gorman said Donnelly, in addition to the \$15,000 cash, would be put on a \$3,000-a-year pension for life.
