Senator and Mrs. "Bill" Pearce of East Palatka, Florida are here to spend the summer and are guests at The Gordon Hotel.

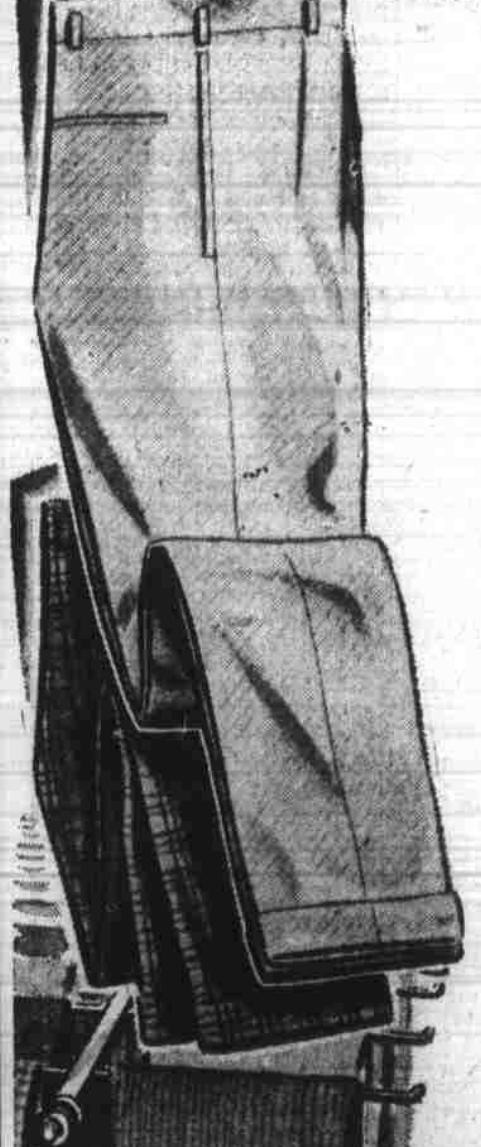
