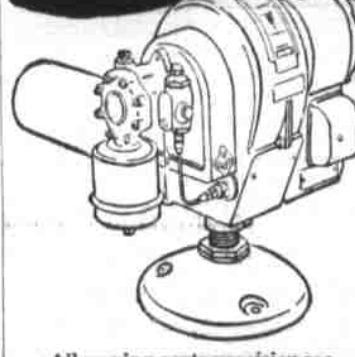
"Yes," replied Jim Dorsett, "he is my father."
